

Welcome to our February Parish News

Dear friends,

Happy New Year! With the double issue magazine for December and January, it is only now that I can offer you greetings as we move into 2022.

What will this year have in store for us? Continuing challenges and uncertainties to be sure!

The month of February finds the Church back in what is known as Ordinary Time. Having completed our great celebration of the Incarnation (God coming to share our human life in the person Jesus) through the seasons of Christmas and Epiphany, we now have a month before we move to the seasons of Lent and Easter when we will celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus.

At the final service of the Epiphany season we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, or Candlemas, and we 'take one last look back to Christmas, and now turn towards the Cross!' Once again, we are reminded that, although without Christmas we would not have had Jesus, without Easter we would not have the Christian faith. We are an Easter people and 'alleluia' is our song.

It is the promise of Easter, the promise of resurrection, that we need to hold on to, to ensure that we are people who, in the words of Bishop Nick Baines, "are not driven by fear, but drawn by hope". Bishop Nick continues, "This is hope that comes to us from the future; resurrection. It is a hope that is not confused with fantasy. It is committed to the life of the present – in all its complexity and muckiness – but refuses to see the present reality as the end or the ultimate".

complex and uncertain. It is hard to believe that it is now two years since the Covid pandemic was declared and our lives were changed in ways we could not have



foreseen. Thankfully, it does seem that the omicron peak may have passed and we can look forward to an easing of the Covid restrictions, albeit with a need for continuing caution in our loving care for one another.

We are also facing new uncertainties in the political world around us.

In the midst of all the challenges we are experiencing, individually and collectively, the need is to hold on to the teachings of Jesus as the One who reveals to us what a fully authentic human life looks like.

In his book *Beauty Will Save the World* Brian Zahnd gives the challenge that in our life together as a community, and in our individual life, the need is constantly to ask ourselves, "Is this beautiful? Is this thought beautiful? Is this word beautiful? Is this attitude beautiful? Is this action beautiful? Does it reflect the beauty of Christ?"

If the word we are about to speak, or the action we are about to carry out, is not beautiful then we should abandon it, because it is not of God and will only harm the other and ourselves.

As we move further into 2022 the challenge is to choose (and we can choose if we want to) to be drawn by hope and not driven by fear and hold fast to the gospel values of love and grace in all of life.


As from the March 2022 edition of the magazine we will only deliver to those who have opted in to this service.

The Season of Lent

Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday on Wednesday 2nd March.** This is one of the Principal Feasts in the church calendar and everyone is encouraged to attend a service on this day. There will be a Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes at St John's, Yealand at 9.15am and at St Oswald's, Warton at 7.30pm.

Lent is a time for prayerful reflection on the meaning of our Lord's Passion. Now is the time to be thinking what you will do as part of your Lenten discipline. Why not take part in one or more of the following activities?

Lent Course—God Has No Favourites

We will using a 5-session course from York Courses. In this course the theologian Carmody Grey accessibly weaves substantial theology with the Bible study, emphasising that we need to unfamiliarise ourselves with the Bible, letting its sheer strangeness jolt us. See next page for further details.

Stations of the Cross

Each of the stations stands for an event that occurred during Jesus' Passion and death at Calvary on Good Friday. The service lasts 30 minutes and will take place each Saturday at 9.30am in St Oswald's, Warton. All are encouraged to experience this service at least once during Lent.

A book for Lent

Why not commit to taking time each day for some devotional reading as we journey through Lent. Here are just three recommendations.


- Embracing Justice (The Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book) by Isabelle Hamley. This book offers a serious-minded exploration of justice in the Bible, with a good deal of attention to the Old Testament before coming to the incarnation, the cross and the Eucharist. Hamley introduces contemporary stories that have engaged her as a social activist and former probation officer. (SPCK £10.99)
- Cries in a Lost Homeland: Reflections on Jesus' sayings from the cross by Guli Francis-Dehqani. Francis-Dehqani is the Bishop of Chelmsford whose family fled Iran at the time of the Islamic Revolution. This book explores Good Friday in dialogue with the painful story of her own family. The reflections are not afraid of the darkness of Good Friday and of human capability. (Canterbury Press £10.99)
- Reflections for Lent: 2 March-16 April 2022 by Christopher Herbert, Philip North, Angela Tilby and Rachel Treweek. Covering Monday to Saturday each week, this book offers reflections written by some of today's leading spiritual and theological writers, including the Bishop of Burnley. (Church House Publishing £4.99)

From our churches

Lent Course — God Has No Favourites

In this 5 session course the theologian Carmody Grey explores how each of us is called to discover that God is completely inclusive. God does not apportion God's welcome or love according to our prejudices or preferences. God Has No Favourites, because God favours everyone.

Every single human being, whatever age, sex, class, race or religion is in God's image. Jesus has identified God's self personally with each one of us, God's love and the power of the Holy Spirit is for everyone, no caveats.



SESSION 1: The best picture of God

God's favour is not dependent on anything we are or anything we do. God's acceptance is unconditional. If we want to know what God 'looks like', we simply need to look at one another.

SESSION 2: Neither Jew nor Gentile

In Christ, God is telling us the most important thing about God's self: God leaves no-one out. Being willing to include everybody is the only rule for those who want to be with Jesus. God is love and, in Christ, humanity is one.

SESSION 3: Neither male nor female

The most profound human difference is that created by our gendered bodies. But even this important difference is superficial compared to the deepest and truest identity of each one of us; through Christ we see that we are all children of God; all heirs to the kingdom of heaven.

SESSION 4: Neither slave nor free

Our world is grossly, torturously unequal, and before Christ came, no-one expected or looked for anything different. Jesus scandalized those around him by acting as though every human being mattered. We are to follow him to the margins.

SESSION 5: What is a Christian?

Jesus did not come to found a religion: he came to give people life. When he wanted his followers to understand his identity and purpose, he didn't give them a theory or explain an idea, he shared a meal with them.

Three groups are planned to meet each week as follows:

- Wednesdays 10.15-11.45am at St John's, Yealand from 9th March;
- Wednesdays 7.30-9.00pm at St Oswald's, Warton from 9th March;
- Thursdays 7.30-9.00pm on Zoom from 10th March.

Please book a place by contacting the Vicar (details on back page) or sign the list available (from mid February) in each of the churches. A minimum of five participants is needed for a group to run. Participants will be asked to pay £4 for the cost of the course booklet.

Eversley choir is a medium sized mixed-voice choir based on the rural South Cumbria/North Lancashire border.

We sing a wide range of music, religious and secular, ancient and modern, and normally hold 3 concerts a year; our Spring concert is usually a substantial work with professional soloists and orchestral accompaniment.

We believe in encouraging young musicians and young singers and have collaborated with several youth groups in recent years. To this end we have also recently started a Choral Scholarship scheme for any young person in full-time education who wishes to further their musical education. We also take part in the biennial Mary Wakefield Festival.

Our Music Director is Ian Jones, founder and MD of Levens Choir and MD of the Cumbria Festival Chorus.

Rehearsals take place on Monday evening in the attractive modern Priest Hutton and Borwick Memorial Hall. New members, particularly tenors and basses, are welcome. We do not hold auditions but you will need to have a good ear, be able to hold a line in fourpart harmonies and have some music reading ability. Most important though are a love of music-making, enthusiasm and willingness to work hard! Members tell us that rehearsals are both enjoyable and challenging and that we are a friendly and welcoming choir. If you are interested in joining us, you are welcome to attend a few rehearsals on a trial basis. We would love to see you ! 



From our schools





DailyHope, a free national telephone line

The line – which is available 24 hours a day

on **0800 804 8044** – has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services during the period of restrictions in mind; to provide comfort and spiritual nourishment to the most isolated in our society.

Options available include materials also available digitally by the Church of England's Communications team such as Prayer During the Day and Night Prayer updated daily, from Common Worship, and a recording of the Church of England weekly national online service.

A section called 'Sleep well with Daily Hope' offers a relaxing guide to getting a good night's sleep. An option entitled 'Chair Exercises on the Phone', provides recorded over-the-phone tuition to keep listeners fit and healthy from the safety of a chair during this time at home.

A prayer for those in need


