





Junior Church

This half of term has got off to a great start with the launch of our Lent Challenge. This is something we do every year and involves inviting every household in the benefice to donate at least one item a week throughout Lent to a local charity that supports people who find themselves in difficult circumstances.



This year we are donating to the Olive Branch in Lancaster and we were very fortunate that one of their volunteers was able to come and talk to us about their work. They support people who find themselves in distress due to things such as job loss, family break down, homelessness, seeking asylum or substance or alcohol misuse.

The volunteer explained that they call the people they help guests rather than clients and that they aim to offer them hospitality, friendship and practical help with their problems. The number of people coming to them has increased enormously during the pandemic and they expect it to continue to rise.

They frequently provide food parcels from their foodbank and we discussed how they try to tailor the parcels to the needs and preferences of the recipients whenever they can. She talked about being able to include a birthday cake for one person and toys for a woman and her children who had just escaped an abusive relationship.

The volunteer also told us about a time when she was delivering food to some asylum seekers and managed to lock her bag, keys and phone in her car. She found herself completely reliant on strangers for help and it gave her an insight into how vulnerable asylum seekers must feel when they arrive in this country.

For those of you who would like to contribute to the Lent Challenge, the items needed each week by the Olive Branch are printed in the pew sheet and can be brought to church on Sunday or dropped off in the vicarage porch. So far, the requests have been for cereal and tinned vegetables the first week, biscuits the second week and long-life puddings and custard on the week this is going to press.

The children have been really thrilled by the number of donations we have received so far and want to say a huge thank you to everyone who is supporting their Lent Challenge.

Junior Church meets every Sunday during term time in St Oswald's Church Hall from 11 - 12am. It is open to children aged 3 to 10 and under 3's accompanied by an adult. We explore out faith together through activities, games, songs, drama and fun! If you would like more information, please contact Vanessa Alpin on 07746 790979.

Revision of the Church Electoral Rolls and Annual Church Meetings Annual Revision of the Church Electoral Rolls

Each year we revise our Church Electoral Rolls for each of the two parishes. Being on a Church Electoral Roll is a way of signifying, firstly, a commitment to the Church of England and secondly, an undertaking to the Church in our Benefice through a specific connection with either the Parish of St Oswald, Warton and St Mary, Borwick or the Parish of St John, Yealand.

Any persons whose name is not on the present roll for the appropriate parish and who wish to have their names entered must apply for enrolment not later than Tuesday 26th April. The new Roll will come into operation on Saturday 30th April. Forms of application for enrolment can be obtained from each of our churches, downloaded from the Benefice website or from the appropriate electoral roll officer: Marjorie Ashton for the Parish of Warton and Borwick; Jean Tunnicliffe Wilson, for the Parish of Yealand.

At the Annual Parochial Church Meetings to only those persons on the relevant electoral roll will be able to vote.

Annual Meeting of Parishioners and Annual Parochial Church Meeting

The dates of the annual meetings in the Benefice are as follows:

- Annual District Church Meeting for St Mary's on Thursday 28th April;
- Annual Meeting of Parishioners and the Annual Parochial Church Meeting for the Parish of St John, Yealand on Wednesday 18th May;
- Annual Meeting of Parishioners and the Annual Parochial Church Meeting for the Parish of St Oswald, Warton and St Mary, Borwick on Sunday 22nd May.

Each of these meetings are important occasions in the life of the church communities in each parish. At the meetings we elect those who will share in the leadership of the parish for the coming year and we have the opportunity to reflect together on the past year and to help think about the future life of God's church in this parish.

The Annual Meetings of Parishioners (open to everyone resident in the parish and those on the church electoral roll) will elect two churchwardens for the coming year for the respective parish. The Annual Parochial Church Meetings (open to those on the church electoral roll) will elect people to serve on the respective Parochial Church Council.

To share in the leadership of God's Church is an important function and everyone is encouraged to consider prayerfully if they are being called by God to serve in this way. We hope as many members of our communities as possible will come to these meetings.

It is not necessarily about doing something 'extra', but about giving yourself space to be the person God has made, and to grow in your relationship with God, with an active, practical response to the teachings of Jesus Christ.

The Vine Community payer is:

Almighty God, whose son Jesus Christ is the True Vine, help us to make space for you in our lives: to abide in you as you abide in us.

Give us grace to grow as Christians in our community: to follow his example and listen to your call; that through our words and our actions, we might bear fruit and show the hope and joy of Jesus Christ in the world.

From the wider Church

Call to pray across the Diocese for Ukraine

Bishop Julian Henderson, Bishop of Blackburn, has written a letter calling people to redouble their prayers for Ukraine. He has given the following suggestions:

First, the Diocese in Europe are holding a half-hour Vigil and Service of Prayer for Ukraine via Zoom each Wednesday until 13th April, at 5pm GMT, to which all are invited. Each vigil will include testimony from some part of the diocese affected directly by the crisis. Second, there is an international initiative for Christians in different countries of the world to stop at different hours of the day to pray for peace, so that there is a continuous chain of prayer through the day. Christians in the UK are invited to stop what they are doing at 3pm each day to pray. This idea is based on an initiative by an adviser to Winston Churchill during the dark days of the Second World War.

Diocesan Prayer for Ukraine

Almighty God, seated above all the affairs of humankind and sovereign over nations and leaders, hear our prayer for Ukraine at this time of war; that lives may be spared, that national boundaries be respected and that forces of aggression be restrained. Grant, Lord God, peace in your world in our time. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen

Leaders of 52 national churches have made a statement on behalf of members calling for an immediate cessation of hostilities towards Ukraine.

The statement reads:

"As 300 delegates from 52 national Member Churches, numerous Christian organisations and ecumenical bodies from across England, we call for the immediate cessation of hostilities, the withdrawal of invading forces and the observance of the Geneva Conventions.

"In this holy season of Lent, we call upon churches everywhere to campaign for an immediate end to the war in Ukraine, and to proclaim the dignity of every human life, whatever its nationality.

"We welcome and commend the extraordinary efforts of countries neighbouring Ukraine in receiving refugees from the war and call on the UK and the whole of Europe

to follow their example. We support every measure to protect the most vulnerable.

We commit ourselves to pray for the nations of Russia and Ukraine, our own Government and people, and for all who find themselves refugees, or bereaved, wounded or destitute. May Christ have mercy upon our world."

CTE Forum is the broadest gathering of churches and Christian organisations in England, gathering 52 national member churches, Christian organisations and intermediate ecumenical bodies.

Meeting at The Hayes, Swanwick on 14-16 March 2022, the Ukrainian crisis was an urgent priority alongside its planned programme considering 'Reconciling Hope — A Broken Church for a Broken World'. The Presidents of CTE and the Fourth Presidency Group make this statement on behalf of the whole of Forum.



It's been a busy half-term in school and everybody is ready for their Easter Holidays. Hopefully the weather will be kind and we can all get outside in the sunshine to work up an appetite for some chocolate eggs!

No doubt Year 5 will be out on their bikes having worked hard to earn their Grade 2 Bikeability award. Using their own bikes, they carried out various safety exercises and learnt how to ride safely on the mean streets of Warton. Well done Year 5 - this is a very important life skill.

Class 1 have been working really hard on their RE last term. They have been studying churches and learning all about what happens in church. They have done some drawings of St Oswald's church and created some beautiful watercolour paintings. They also made their own church models out of blocks and labelled the different features. 
