Welcome to our Summer Parish News

Dear friends,

Following the celebration of the Day of Pentecost on 5th June, which brought the great season of Easter to a close, the Church moved into what is known as 'Ordinary Time'. After the fifty days of Easter the church's surroundings and worship returned to a gentler pace. The colour of Ordinary Time is green, the colour of nature and the everyday world around us.

But, although we may have moved on from the intensity of the Easter season, this does not mean our life of worship and our activities become ordinary and mundane; far from it! For the Christian Church every Sunday is a little Easter, a joyful celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. Every act of worship for the Christian community is a time to renew our commitment to explore what it means to be followers of Jesus as beloved children of God.

As we settle into the long period of Ordinary Time (which runs until Advent Sunday on 27th November), for many people thoughts also turn to the theme of holidays, special times spent with family and friends, times to draw apart from the busy routines of work, school or college. Holidays (the word comes from an Old English word meaning 'holy day' or 'consecrated day') are times to live differently for a while and, hopefully, find rest and renewal in body, mind and spirit.

For some holidays are opportunities to travel and discover new places or revisit favourite ones. For some holidays may be spent at home, simply enjoying a different pace of life. Whether we travel physically away from home or stay at home, our

holidays/holy days can always be times of journeying and times of renewal and refreshing.

Many great teachers about the spiritual life have written or spoken of how it is the journey, rather than the destination, that is of most importance. It is the openness to discovering what is 'just around the corner' or 'over the next hill' that keeps us alive to the new life that always awaits us as we journey on both outwardly and physically and inwardly and spiritually.

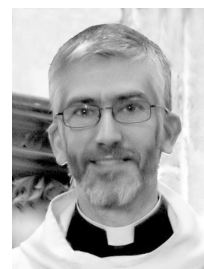
Journeys also give us opportunity to become more aware of the world around us. This may prompt our questions about who we are in relation to our fellow travellers in our community or society. We may find ourselves asking what makes for a healthy community or society; what are the values that bind the peoples of the world together into one common humanity; what are the values that make you the person you are?

The Christian understands there to be two commands that underpin a healthy community: love God and love your neighbour. Jesus expands our understanding of neighbour to include those who are not like us, those who we might consider our enemy.

As you journey on through this summer with its holidays/holy days think about what it means to love God and love your neighbour at home, at work, at school, locally, nationally and globally.

From our churches

Following the recent resumption of offering communion in both kinds (bread and wine), having been giving communion in one kind (bread) only during the Covid-19 pandemic, we are repeating the article on intinction first published in the Summer 2021 edition of the magazine.

Receiving Communion by Intinction

Intinction is the practice whereby a communicant at the Eucharist, having received the consecrated bread on the hand, does not immediately consume the bread, but retains it in order to then dip the bread into the wine, as a means of receiving communion in both kinds.

For some time some people have raised questions across the Church as to whether the practice should be discouraged, or not permitted at all. Concerns about intinction relate to two issues.

Firstly, that of hygiene, given that it is not always possible to ensure that a person's fingers do not touch the wine.

Secondly, that of an increasing awareness of some people's reaction to gluten. Whilst gluten-free bread can be provided as an alternative to the regular wheat bread, what is often overlooked is that dipping wheat wafers into the wine can introduce gluten which others then drink.

Understandably, some people do not agree with these concerns and feel that intinction does not pose any greater risk than sipping the wine from the communion chalice nor does it pose a significant risk to those who are coeliac or gluten-intolerant.

At present, as part of the Covid-19 pandemic restrictions, communion is received in the form of bread only by the congregation. In anticipation of the resumption of receiving communion in the form of both bread and wine when all Covid restrictions are lifted, both the PCCs in our Benefice recently considered whether to change the local policy and not permit intinction. Both PCCs gave the matter careful consideration and, interestingly, came to different conclusions.

The Warton PCC voted overwhelmingly to change the current practice and not permit intinction in future at St Oswald's and St Mary's.

The Yealand PCC voted evenly between being in favour of change, being against change and abstaining. This means the practice of intinction continues to be allowed at St John's.

From the Diocese of Blackburn



Retirement of the Bishop of Blackburn



After more than nine years in the role, the Bishop of Blackburn, the Rt Rev. Julian Henderson, is preparing to enter the final weeks of his ministry as The Church of England's Diocesan Bishop for the County of Lancashire.

Bishop Julian retires this summer and will move with his wife Heather to Sussex to be closer to family at the end of July, before attending the Lambeth Conference.

Bishop Julian's final day at work in the Diocese will be Saturday 16th July. In the morning he will attend his last Diocesan Synod meeting. Later, at 2.00pm he will attend his farewell service at Blackburn Cathedral.



During his tenure as the ninth Bishop of Blackburn, Bishop Julian has overseen a huge transformative programme to reposition the work of the Diocese. Most notably and prayerfully in 2015/2016, he led the launch of a new strategic approach to our work entitled 'Vision 2026, Healthy Churches Transforming Communities'.

This Vision was embedded in the key principles of making disciples, growing leaders, being witnesses and inspiring children and young people for Jesus Christ and parishes have been encouraged ever since to engage with it in ways that suited their local settings.



On 24th June Bishop Julian made his final speech in the House of Lords. In his 'valedictory speech', Bishop Julian took the opportunity to reflect on his time in the 'special Red Rose County of Lancashire'; on the work of his 'great team' striving together to achieve the aims of our Diocesan 'Vision 2026: Healthy Churches Transforming Communities' and also to thank their Lordships for their good wishes on his departure.

In his speech, part of a debate on a report into the 'stresses upon the Union of the United Kingdom', Bishop Julian also took the opportunity to emphasise the importance of the current 'levelling up agenda' saying: "Reducing the gaps in our society in terms of wealth and aspiration (is) something we in the North West are desperate to see taken forward. Government support for the Eden North project in Morecambe Bay is one example of what will bring massive transformation, in terms of jobs and the growth of the local economy in Lancashire."

Prayer for the next Bishop of Blackburn

Heavenly Father, we pray for a bishop full of your Holy Spirit: a disciple who makes disciples, a bold witness to Jesus, and a Christ-like leader, able to inspire children and young people with the transforming message of your Gospel. We ask this in the name of your Son, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

From the Church of England

General Synod meets at York in July with debates from Ukraine war to online safety

Members of the General Synod will meet at York University in July to debate a range of topics from Russia's illegal invasion of Ukraine, to protection of children and young people from online pornography.

Other subjects on the agenda include plans by the Church Commissioners to distribute £3.6 billion to the frontline work of the Church of England between 2023 and 2031, announced earlier this year by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York.

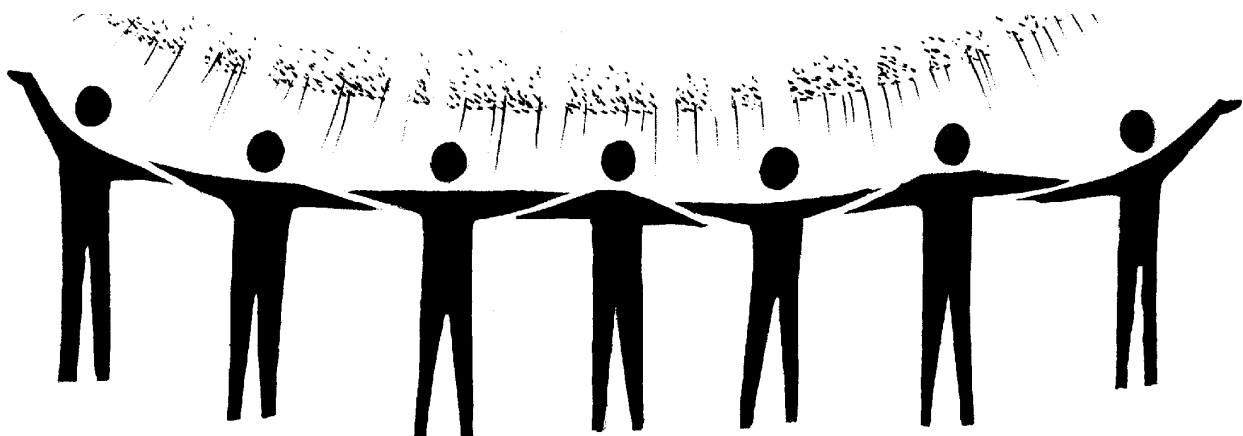
Further debates will include the [route map for churches, dioceses and Cathedrals to achieving net zero carbon by 2030](#) and a call for the Church of England to commit to working towards the removal of all remaining barriers to full participation for people with disabilities in the life and ministry of the church.

A Guildford Diocesan Synod motion will urge the Government to pass legislation requiring pornographic websites to have age verification systems preventing access by people under the age of 18.

Members will also debate a Private Member's Motion opposing assisted suicide and calling for more funding for palliative care.

Other debates include a report outlining a proposed overhaul of legislation governing clergy discipline. There will also be a presentation on safeguarding, and discussion on its future oversight followed by a separate debate.

The General Synod will meet at York University from Friday 8th July to Tuesday 12th July. This is the first time the Synod has met in York in person since the pandemic.
