Welcome to our September Parish News

Dear friends,

I am writing this on Ukraine's Independence Day, which this year also marks six months since Russia invaded Ukraine. The United Nations Secretary General Antonio Guterres described the day as a "sad and tragic milestone", adding that the consequences of the "sad and senseless war" were being felt far beyond Ukraine.

The war in Ukraine continues to be a blight on the global landscape. No one is immune from the impact of this and many other conflicts that continue around the world. According to the Council on Foreign Relation's Global Conflict Tracker, there are currently 27 ongoing conflicts worldwide. This means that a quarter of the entire global population lives in conflict-affected areas. According to the UN, last year, 84 million people were forcibly displaced because of conflict, violence and human rights violations.

All this is a tragic and constant reminder that the world is a highly complex web of nation-states and people-groups. Something of this complexity was evident at the recent Lambeth Conference, the gathering of bishops from across the worldwide Anglican Communion. On page 11 you can read one bishop's reflection on his encounters with colleagues from all corners of the earth. This bishop's imagination was stretched "far more than I thought it could be" by an increased awareness of "the immense breadth and variety of the cultures, peoples and hopes bound up in...the Anglican Communion".

The reality is that we are bound to one another as those who inhabit this planet.

We do not live in splendid isolation as individuals and what happens in one part of our world can quickly impact on everyone. It has always been thus, from the origins of human culture. The



question remains, how to turn the hearts and minds of all people towards the values of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self -control; values that the Christian knows as the 'fruit of the Spirit' (Galatians 5.22-23).

This summer has also starkly reminded us of the global challenge of the climate crisis. On page 8 and 9 you can read about the Season of Creation that the Christian Churches are invited to observe each September. A year ago we were eagerly anticipating the COP26 UN Climate Conference being held in Glasgow. This year COP27 is being held in Egypt in November. We join with Pope Francis in seeking a "loving awareness that we are disconnected from not the rest of creatures, but joined in a splendid universal communion".

The month of September is always a time of new beginnings for many people, especially our children and young people. At the start of this new academic year we offer our prayers and best wishes to all pupils and students in our schools, colleges and universities, and to all teaching and support staff.

May God our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer bless and guide us.

Listen to the Voice of creation

The Season of Creation is the annual Christian celebration of prayer and action for our common home. Together, the ecumenical family around the world unites to pray and protect and advocate for God's creation.

The season starts on 1st September, the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on 4th October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations.

This year's theme is 'Listen to the Voice of Creation'.

The Psalmist declares, "The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims God's handiwork. Day to day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge...their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out through all the Earth, and their words to the end of the world." (19: 1-4)

During the Season of Creation, our common prayer and action can help us listen for the voices of those who are silenced. In prayer we lament the individuals, communities, species, and ecosystems who are lost, and those whose livelihoods are threatened by habitat loss and climate change. In prayer we centre the cry of the Earth and the cry of the poor.

May this 2022 Season of Creation renew our ecumenical unity, renewing and uniting us by our bond of Peace in one Spirit, in our call to care for our common home. And may this season of prayer and action be a time to Listen to the Voice of Creation, so that our lives in words and deeds proclaim good news for all the Earth.

Message from Pope Francis for the Celebration of the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

Dear brothers and sisters!

"Listen to the voice of creation" is the theme and invitation of this year's Season of Creation.

If we learn how to listen, we can hear in the voice of creation a kind of dissonance. On the one hand, we can hear a sweet song in praise of our beloved Creator; on the other, an anguished plea, lamenting our mistreatment of this our common home.

The sweet song of creation invites us to practise an "ecological spirituality" (*Laudato Si', 216),* attentive to God's presence in the natural world. It is a summons to base our spirituality on the "loving awareness that we are not disconnected from the rest of creatures, but joined in a splendid universal communion" (*ibid., 220*)...In this Season of Creation, we pray once more in the great cathedral of creation, and revel in the "grandiose cosmic choir" made up of countless creatures, all singing the praises of God. Let us join Saint Francis of Assisi in singing: "Praise be to you, my Lord, for all your creatures" (cf. Canticle of Brother Sun). Let us join the psalmist in singing, "Let everything that breathes praise the Lord!" (Ps 150:6).

The COP27 conference on climate change, to be held in Egypt in November 2022 represents the next opportunity for all to join in promoting the effective implementation of the Paris Agreement...The effort to achieve the Paris goal of limiting temperature increase to 1.5°C is quite demanding; it calls for responsible cooperation between all nations in presenting climate plans or more ambitious nationally determined contributions in order to reduce to zero, as quickly as possible, net greenhouse gas emissions.

For its part, the COP15 summit on biodiversity, to be held in Canada in December, will offer to the goodwill of governments a significant opportunity to adopt a new multilateral agreement to halt the destruction of ecosystems and the extinction of species. According to the ancient wisdom of the Jubilee, we need to "remember, return, rest and restore".

Let me repeat: "In the name of God, I ask the great extractive industries – mining, oil, forestry, real estate, agribusiness – to stop destroying forests, wetlands, and mountains, to stop polluting rivers and seas, to stop poisoning food and people".

How can we fail to acknowledge the existence of an "ecological debt" (*Laudato Si'*, 51) incurred by the economically richer countries, who have polluted most in the last two centuries; this demands that they take more ambitious steps at COP27 and at COP15.

During this Season of Creation, let us pray that COP27 and COP15 can serve to unite the human family in effectively confronting the double crisis of climate change and the reduction of biodiversity. Mindful of the exhortation of Saint Paul to rejoice with those who rejoice and to weep with those who weep (cf. Rom 12:15), let us weep with the anguished plea of creation. Let us hear that plea and respond to it with deeds, so that we and future generations can continue to rejoice in creation's sweet song of life and hope.

The Lambeth Conference

The 15th Lambeth Conference met from 26rh July – 8th August.

Convened by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lambeth Conference is an international meeting of Anglican bishops.

The conference discusses church and world affairs and the global mission of the Anglican Communion.

This event plays an influential role in the life of the Anglican Communion and takes place usually every 10 years (although the current conference has been delayed due to the pandemic). Its purpose is to gather together bishops and spouses for prayer, bible study, worship and fellowship and helps shape the life of the Anglican Communion for the coming decade.

Our Bishops, Rt Revd Julian Henderson, Bishop of Blackburn; Rt Revd Philip North, Bishop of Burnley and Rt Revd Dr Jill Duff, Bishop of Lancaster attended the conference (it was Bishop Julian's last commitment before officially retiring at the end of August).

The conference theme this time was 'God's Church for God's World - walking, listening and witnessing together' and the Biblical focus was the book of 1 Peter. A wide range of resources were developed for use in Bible studies, discussions and seminars.

Introducing the book of 1 Peter, the Archbishop of Canterbury said:

"1 Peter is a book that doesn't shy away from difficult things. It's a book that addresses the challenges that Peter's communities were facing. It speaks about belonging, alienation, exile, slavery and persecution –. – you can immediately hear the echoes in our world today.

"It's a book that raises an utterly compelling and inspiring vision of God's kingdom. It raises our eyes beyond the immediacy of our struggles and differences. It urges us to hear a far deeper call. Through our faith in Jesus Christ, Peter encourages us to live lives of witness, hope and holiness as God's chosen people."

At the Conference the bishops gathered adopted a process called Lambeth Calls. "Lambeth Calls" is the name given to describe declarations, affirmations and common calls to the church shared by bishops that took part in the Conference. Lambeth Calls were shared on these themes:

- Mission and Evangelism
- Safe Church Christian Unity
- Reconciliation
- Environment and Sustainable Development
- Inter-faith Relations
- Anglican Identity
- Human Dignity

Lambeth Conference video highlights on YouTube



Many of the bishops attending the conference offered reflections once they had returned home. One particularly powerful reflection that shows the diverse challenges being experienced across the world was written by Bishop Mark Edington of The Episcopal Church.


- I couldn't imagine being a bishop in a place where your communities are divided between different tribes, in a place where tribal identity is something people kill each other over. But my for my brother Bishop Richard, who ministers in western South Sudan, that's the mission of God.
- I couldn't imagine being a bishop in a place where the language of my people would mean speaking of God with the word "Allah" – and being taken to court to deny my church the right to use the word. But for my brother Bishop Nelson of Eastern Malaysia, that's the mission of God. (Ultimately the court in Malaysia ruled that Christians could indeed use the word – but tensions have not abated.)
- I could not imagine being a bishop in a diocese where the rate of suicides in the communities I serve is ten times higher than the national average because of hopelessness, despair, and the inheritance oppression in indigenous communities. But for my brother Bishop Joey, who ministers in the Diocese of the Arctic in Canada, that is the mission of God.
- I could not imagine being a bishop in a place where young Muslim men are promised money if they impregnate Christian girls; but for my brother Bishop Vithalis, who cares for communities in the region of Tanzania nearest the Ugandan border, that is the mission of God.
- I couldn't imagine being a bishop in a place where, after more than a century of service to the local community in running schools and a health clinic, a Hindu nationalist government would openly discuss taking the schools by force, refuse permission to train new teachers, or threaten to pave a road through the middle of the compound. But for my sister Bishop Pushpa, the first woman to be made a bishop in the Church of South India, that is the mission of God.
- And I couldn't imagine what it would be like to be a bishop so trapped in the assumptions and expectations of the surrounding culture and its economic structures that other bishops would think tragic an inability to understand or effectively act against the damage wrought by that culture to God's creation, and the climate that is its breath. But I learned that for so many bishops outside the West, **that is exactly how they first see me**.

Depending on the window you look through, the Lambeth meeting offered glimpses of outrageous hope, times of profound disagreement, moments of profound humility, and a heightened awareness – for all present – of the immense breadth and variety of the cultures, peoples, and hopes bound up in this idea called the "Anglican Communion."

I certainly have been changed, in good ways, by this experience. My imagination has been stretched far more than I thought it could be.






The next Messy Church is on Sunday 18th September and is Messy Harvest. Do come along and join in the fun from 4-6pm.


We send around 18 containers to rural African communities every year, full of tools that have been collected from across the UK, and refurbished in our refurbishment centres.


