
As from the March edition of the Parish News, copies will be delivered to people who have requested this option; other people can pick up a print copy from one of our churches or from Warton Post Office.

Welcome to our September Parish News

Dear friends,

September was a month of significant change in the life of our nation. On Tuesday 6th September Boris Johnson tendered his resignation to The Queen as Prime Minister and a short time later Liz Truss was invited by The Queen to form a new government. Whilst pictures of Liz Truss meeting The Queen showed The Queen looking frail, it was a great shock when just two days later on Thursday 8th September The Queen died.

A new Prime Minister and a new Sovereign; both changes have given us much to think about and reflect on. The Queen had reigned for 70 years, so most of us had only ever known Queen Elizabeth II as our Sovereign. The Queen saw 15 Prime Ministers during her reign, so all of us have known several leaders of the government.

The ten days of national mourning for The Queen were a deeply powerful time which saw an outpouring of heartfelt gratitude for all that Queen Elizabeth II represented to this nation, the Commonwealth and others around the world. The sight of The Queue in London, a quarter of a million people waiting patiently to pass by The Queen lying-in-state, was itself deeply moving.

Throughout the period of mourning, and especially on the day of the state funeral, many tributes to The Queen referred to her strong Christian faith. The Queen was able to share her faith particularly through her Christmas messages. One example is from her message in 2002:

'I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God!'

On pages 8 and 9 you can read the Archbishop of Canterbury's sermon at the state funeral and Bishop



Philip's reflection on Her Late Majesty; both merit careful reading.

We now pray for our new sovereign, His Majesty King Charles III, and for all the Royal family. We pray for a continuing commitment to lives of service in the pursuit of the common good of all people.

The pursuit of the common good of all is, of course, a core Christian principle. What so much of our scriptures makes clear is that every human being is in the image and likeness of God and we each have equal dignity in the kingdom of faith.

The task of a government should be to reduce the inequality which exists across society. One measure of the health and wellbeing of a nation is the gap between the rich and the poor, the haves and the have nots. The United Nations has a number of Sustainable Development Goals. Goal 10 is to 'reduce inequality within and among countries'; "Reducing inequalities and ensuring no one is left behind are integral to achieving the SDG. Inequality is a persistent cause for concern".

The early days of the new government have given great cause for alarm. Many would echo the words of Pope Francis who said, "trickle-down theories ... express a crude and naïve trust in the goodness of those wielding economic power ... Meanwhile the excluded are still waiting".

We pray for a greater spirit of compassion from those in power towards all people.

Harvest Collection and Harvest Appeal

As in previous years the non-perishable items brought to our Harvest Festival services across the Benefice will be given to the Lancaster and District Homeless Action Service and the perishable items will be given to St John's Hospice.

As well as brining our harvest gifts to church, everyone is encourage to support the Bishop's Harvest Appeal. This year's appeal is raising money to make a difference to the lives of women and their families in Burundi. We will be supporting the work of the Mothers' Union, a worldwide Christian



charity, through their Literacy and Numeracy Project which aims to lift 2,500 people out of poverty over the next two years.



As one of the poorest countries on earth, with the majority of people living on less than £1.50 a day, by giving what you can, together we can make a significant difference to the lives of our people in Burundi who are in desperate need.

Nearly 6,000 miles away from the UK, Burundi, situated near the great Lakes in East Africa, is one of the poorest countries in the world.

Women in particular are very poor; nearly half are illiterate and have no financial education so they can't read, write or understand maths. They are prevented from reaching their potential and fulfilling their dreams.

In total, 92% of people work in agriculture, harvesting crops like sweet potatoes, bananas, cassava and peanuts. There is a good climate but, due to the lack of education, the land isn't being used to its full potential.

The Mothers' Union is raising money to fund a two-year project which aims to support 2,500 women by providing adult literacy, savings, business and agricultural skills.

All this, alongside gender training; with the aim of giving women the tools to change their situations, to lift themselves, and their families, out of a cycle of poverty.

Bible Study Group


A monthly bible study group meets on the second Monday of each month from 10am until 12 noon at Fernlands, Tewitfield.

Remembering Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

The following prayer was written by The Rt Revd Julian Henderson, the recently retired Bishop of Blackburn.

We come to you, our everlasting God, at a time of change and sadness, following the death of our Sovereign Lady Queen Elizabeth.

Your call to her and Your anointing of her 70 year reign have been a blessing to this nation and around the world.



We bring our thanks to You for a life of dutiful and willing service right to the end and a life of active faith and hope in Jesus Christ.

We ask for Your comfort and strength for her family as they grieve and take on new responsibilities.

Guide the King as a different era unfolds and may the days that lie ahead build on the legacy of that which has gone before and promote faith, justice and peace in our land, through Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

The Archbishop of Canterbury's Sermon at the State Funeral

Come Holy Spirit, fill us with the balm of your healing love. Amen.

The pattern for many leaders is to be exalted in life and forgotten after death. The pattern for all who serve God – famous or obscure, respected or ignored – is that death is the door to glory.

Her Late Majesty famously declared on a 21st birthday broadcast that her whole life would be dedicated to serving the Nation and Commonwealth.

Rarely has such a promise been so well kept! Few leaders receive the outpouring of love that we have seen.

Jesus – who in our reading does not tell his disciples how to follow, but who to follow – said: "I am the way, the truth and the life". Her Late Majesty's example was not set through her position or her ambition, but through whom she followed. I know His Majesty shares the same faith and hope in Jesus Christ as his mother; the same sense of service and duty.

In 1953 the Queen began her Coronation with silent prayer, just there at the High Altar. Her allegiance to God was given before any person gave allegiance to her. Her service to so many people in this nation, the Commonwealth and the world, had its foundation in her following Christ – God himself – who said that he "came not to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." ¹

People of loving service are rare in any walk of life. Leaders of loving service are still rarer. But in all cases those who serve will be loved and remembered when those who cling to power and privileges are long forgotten.

The grief of this day – felt not only by the late Queen's family but all round the nation, Commonwealth and the world – arises from her abundant life and loving

service, now gone from us.

She was joyful, present to so many, touching a multitude of lives.

We pray especially for all her family, grieving as every family at a funeral - including so many families round the world who have themselves lost someone recently - but in this family's case doing so in the brightest spotlight.

May God heal their sorrow, may the gap left in their lives be marked with memories of joy and life.

Her Late Majesty's broadcast during Covid lockdown ended with: "We will meet again", words of hope from a song of Vera Lynn. Christian hope means certain expectation of something not yet seen.

Christ rose from the dead and offers life to all, abundant life now and life with God in eternity.

As the Christmas carol says "where meek souls will receive him, still the dear Christ enters in." $^{\rm 2}$

We will all face the merciful judgement of God: we can all share the Queen's hope which in life and death inspired her servant leadership.

Service in life, hope in death. All who follow the Queen's example, and inspiration of trust and faith in God, can with her say: "We will meet again."

Reflection from the Bishop of Burnley on Her Late Majesty

For this message I am standing in Blackburn Cathedral next to an extraordinary art installation made to celebrate 70 years of Her Majesty.

Little did we know just a few weeks ago when we were opening it that the Queen was so close to her death; and now we are thinking and reflecting back after the most extraordinary period of mourning.

I expect quite a lot of us will need a long time to process our recent experiences. We have seen beautiful scenes of mourning with people queuing on the streets; we have seen incredibly beautiful acts of worship and music. People have really come together and supported each other.

We have seen a smooth transfer of power and what a gift that is; something never to be taken for granted. And I'm thinking, what will the legacy of this extraordinary life be? What will be the legacy of the Queen's service?

Because my prayer is that many will be inspired by her to make their lives a gift and to give themselves away in service of their communities, especially the poorest. And what would be the legacy of her faith; her strong, personal relationship with Jesus Christ?

I would love to think that people across Lancashire and across the country will reflect on what inspired her life of dedication and will explore who Jesus is, what he came to do and what it means to be in a relationship with Him today.

I would love to see these two legacies: the legacy of service and the legacy of faith, as we come to the end of 10 remarkable days.

From our Villages





If you are looking for something for your children to do that will give them "Everyday Adventure" and "Skills for Life," your local Scout Group is worth a look.

Scouting is, first of all, great fun and generally a barrel of laughs; we get outdoors as much as we can and we camp, hike, cook, play games, make stuff, help the local environment, canoe and sail, carry out expeditions, raise money for good causes... we help others, we learn useful skills such as first aid and dealing with emergencies, navigation, teamwork, leadership... we try to build resilience and initiative and we learn to get on with others and make friends for life.

At the age of 6 you might be a Beaver Scout enjoying running around games and craft activities (though you would do so much more too); by the age of 16, you might be an Explorer Scout on an expedition to the Himalayas watching the sun rise over Mount Everest... or, as we like to put it "Glue and Glitter to The Roof of The World".

Your local Scout Group, 1st Warton, covers Warton (including Millhead), the Yealands and the surrounding rural areas and most of our members come from these villages, though we also have members from as far afield as Arnside, Arkholme, Milnthorpe and so on. We have a Beaver Scout Colony for (6-8 year olds), a Cub Scout Pack for (8-10.5 year olds) and a Scout Troop (for 10.5-14 year olds). There is a lot of flexibility in the various age ranges, to suit individual circumstances. Scouting is not just for boys; half our Group are girls.

The Beaver Colony meets on Mondays (5.45-6.45 pm) at Warton Village Hall, The Cub Pack also meets on Mondays (6.45-8.15 pm) at Warton Village Hall, The Scout Troop meets on Fridays (7-9 pm) at Yealand Village Hall.

The Group currently has ten adult Leaders/Assistants and a number of other adult helpers, either working directly with the Beavers, Cubs or Scouts or in "backroom" roles. We also have a large number of "Young Leaders" (14-18 years old) who help with the various Sections of the Group and most of whom are also members of one our local Explorer Scout Units. Currently, there are about 70 young people associated with the Group. If our meeting times don't suit your circumstances, there are also excellent Scout Groups nearby in Carnforth and Silverdale (we can put you in touch).






We send around 18 containers to rural African communities every year, full of tools that have been collected from across the UK, and refurbished in our refurbishment centres.




A prayer for those who mourn
