

Welcome to our November Parish News

Dear friends,

Last month I wrote that "September was a month of significant change in the life of our nation" with a new Sovereign and a new Prime Minister. I am not sure that any of us expected October to be a month of yet another significant change in the life of our nation with another new Prime Minister!

Rishi Sunak is the UK's third Prime Minister in less than two months – the fifth in six years. It is the fastest turnover of leaders in No 10 for nearly a century. Perhaps we are left wondering how long until the next change.

Whatever our political views we must pray for those who serve us in national and local government. The challenges facing us all are great and we have seen how quickly a high-risk policy decision can severely impact the lives of so many.

It can certainly seem that the world's problems are too many and too much. Speaking ahead of the COP27 climate change conference which begins in Egypt on 6th November, the UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres said that countries must re-prioritise climate change or the world faces catastrophe. "This is the defining issue of our time, nobody has the right to sacrifice international action on climate change for any reason", he warned.

As we watch what happens in Sharm-el-Sheikh in Egypt we must pray for those who have the power and influence to affect the future life and wellbeing of our planet and its inhabitants. We must pray that well-meaning words are translated into real and lasting action.

This is about the future survival of human society. We all need to play our part to find

a way to bring about a new common future. This will, of course, mean sacrifice, paying attention to the experience and perspectives of others.



Much of this is brought into focus in November by the Church calendar, with the celebration at the start of the month of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. A week later the Church helps the nation observe Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday. These days each invite us to reflect on what it means to live in relation with all the peoples of the world - past, present and future.

At this time of year as we look back and reflect on the impact of events close at home and far away, we also think about how these events continue to influence the way the world thinks and behaves today. We look around us and we are left calling out, 'Surely there must be another way!'

There is another way and the Jesus story shows us that way. It was summed up wonderfully by the writer Henri Nouwen when he suggested that each of us asks ourselves the following questions at the end of each day: Did I offer peace today? Did I bring a smile to someone's face? Did I say words of healing? Did I let go of my anger and resentment? Did I forgive? Did I love?

As we reflect on all that the world is facing right now, let us commit to offering peace, bringing a smile, speaking words of healing; let us be people of forgiveness and love.

God bless you at this time of remembrance and thanksgiving.

Season of Remembrance — All Saints to Advent

In the Church calendar the period during November from the celebration of All Saints' Day on 1st November to the celebration of Christ the King later in the month is a season of remembrance.

The following introduction to the season is taken from the Church of England Common Worship book *Times and Seasons*.

No Christian is solitary. Through baptism we become members one of another in Christ, members of a company of saints whose mutual belonging transcends death:

One family, we dwell in him, one Church, above, beneath; though now divided by the stream, the narrow stream of death. (Charles Wesley)

All Saints' Day and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed on All Souls' Day both celebrate this mutual belonging. All Saints' Day celebrates men and women in whose lives the Church as a whole has seen the grace of God powerfully at work. It is an opportunity to give thanks for that grace, and for the wonderful ends to which it shapes a human life; it is a time to be encouraged by the example of the saints and to recall that sanctity may grow in the ordinary circumstances, as well as the extraordinary crises, of human living. The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed celebrates the saints in a more local and intimate key. It allows us to remember with thanksgiving before God those whom we have known more directly: those who gave us life, or who nurtured us in faith.

Redemption is a work of God's grace; it is God who redeems us in Christ and there is nothing to be done beyond what Christ has done. But we still wait for the final consummation of God's new creation in Christ; those who are Christ's, whether or not they have passed through death, are joined in prayer that God's kingdom will be revealed finally and in all its fullness. We also sense that it is a fearful thing to come before the unutterable goodness and holiness of God, even for those who are redeemed in Christ; that it is searing as well as life-giving to experience God's mercy; and this instinct also is expressed in the liturgy of All Souls' Day.

Remembrance Sunday goes on to explore the theme of memory, both corporate and individual, as we confront issues of war and peace, loss and self-gift, memory and forgetting.

The annual cycle of the Church's year now ends with the Feast of Christ the King. The year that begins with the hope of the coming Messiah ends with the proclamation of his universal sovereignty. The ascension of Christ has revealed him to be Lord of earth and heaven. The Feast of Christ the King returns us to Advent, with which the cycle once more begins.

MEETING JESUS IN THE GOSPEL OF JOHN

Join our 2022 Diocesan Conference from your home.

Our diocesan conference this year is focused on St John's gospel. All the licensed clergy and one representative from each parish have been invited, but we hope that many more people across Lancashire will be able to benefit from the conference. The main sessions outlined below will be livestreamed and will then remain available to watch later, all on The Church of England in Lancashire's YouTube channel: www.youtube.com/user/blackburndiocese

Mornings: 'Word'

Each morning session will begin with an introduction by art historian Dr Deborah Lewer, leading into a keynote talk by a theologian. Professor Richard Bauckham is a leading scholar of St John's gospel; now retired from Cambridge University. Dr Anderson Jeremiah is a priest in our diocese and senior lecturer in World Christianity at Lancaster University. Dr Michael Leyden is the first principal of Emmanuel Theological College here in the North West Thursdays 'Word' will be set within an extended celebration of the Eucharist.

Evenings: 'Word made flesh'

Monday and Tuesday evenings will offer a more informal programme with worship; an interview and a talk linking faith to living. Our first evening speaker is Rachel Gardner who has worked with young people for more than two decades and is part of the leadership of St Luke's Resource Church in Blackburn. Meanwhile, Dr Ruth Valerio is an environmentalist, theologian, social activist and the Global Advocacy Director of Tearfund.
