



Welcome to our December/January Parish News

Dear friends,

During December we travel through the season of Advent, the time of preparation for the great celebration of Christmas when we remember the moment in history when God came to reveal God's self in the human face of Jesus.

The story of God in Jesus is a story of God sharing fully in our humanity, the good and the bad, the highs and the lows. In a world that continues to face great challenges from the war in Ukraine, the climate crisis and the aftermath of the Covid pandemic which has turned into the cost of living crisis, God comes to offer a new vision; a vision of a new way of being.

The drama of God's story, which became the Jesus story, is shocking, it is radical and subversive. As Bishop Michael Curry said: "Jesus did not establish an institution, though institutions can serve his cause. He did not organize a political party, though his teachings have a profound impact on politics. Jesus did not even found a religion. No, Jesus began a movement, fuelled by his Spirit, a movement whose purpose was and is to change the face of the earth from the nightmare it often is into the dream that God intends."

A year ago we were reflecting on the outcome of the COP26 UN Climate Change conference held in Glasgow. I quoted the Church of England's lead bishop for environmental affairs who said, "We must now keep up the moral pressure so that pledges are urgently turned into measurable action". Now we reflect on COP27 recently held in Egypt. Bishop Graham Usher said the conference "gave cause for hope in some ways, but frustration in others. On the positive side, can welcome the we agreement about a Loss and Damage fund...Those are the first steps towards climate justice, but they must continue at pace. However, whilst the commitment to 'keep 1.5 alive' is still there, it is not yet matched by enough



global ambition to phase out fossil usage. It may even be that we have missed the boat to achieve this, but is it something that we must continue to push for. Every fraction of a degree matters. World leaders, indeed all of us, must ask: how many more of our targets can be missed?"

There are great challenges ahead for all of us as we prepare to leave 2022 behind and move into 2023. In the midst of change and uncertainty, we are called to hold on to the message of Christmas, that God is with us. God came, and still comes, amongst us in Jesus; to show us that a love that reaches out with a genuine compassion for everyone is possible. The challenge is to accept that, as one Bishop said, 'In the end, there is no one God does not love'.

As we come to celebrate once again the Christmas story, the story of God coming to live a human life, think about the story as being about God choosing to get God's hands dirty. The incarnation is about God choosing to get stuck in amongst the nitty gritty of life, not staying on the side-line and just watching it all happen.

God comes calling and challenging; God comes inviting us to believe and trust that God's ways are worth following. So, this Christmas we think again about the message of God's radical, inclusive, transforming love for all Creation and all humankind.

May Jesus find a place in your heart this Christmas and New Year.






Advent

Advent is a season of expectation and preparation, as the Church prepares to celebrate the coming (adventus) of Christ in his incarnation. The readings and liturgies direct us towards Christ's birth, and the promise of God's presence with us always, in every time and every place.

The anticipation of Christmas under commercial pressure has made it harder to sustain the appropriate sense of alert watchfulness, but the fundamental Advent prayer remains 'Maranatha' – 'Our Lord, come' (1 Corinthians 16.22).



Church decorations are simple and spare, and purple is the traditional liturgical colour. In the northern hemisphere, the Advent season falls at the darkest time of the year, and the natural symbols of darkness and light are powerfully at work throughout Advent and Christmas.

Christmas

The celebration of Christ's incarnation at Christmas is one of the two poles of the Christian year. The wonderful mystery of God's dwelling among us in the fullness of humanity, as Emmanuel, foretold by the prophets and born of Mary, provides the material of the feast:

Christmas is much more then than simply the celebration of Jesus' birth. The task of the Christmas liturgy is to recall us, amid all the joyful customs and celebrations of Christmas, to this central truth of the Word made flesh for our salvation.



It is, of course, Christ's nativity that has provided the occasion for this festival of the incarnation, since the end of the third century. The Christmas crib and the nativity play can both be said to descend from the tableau of Christ's birth that Francis of Assisi arranged when he celebrated Christmas at Greccio in 1223. Christmas carols are a medieval tradition, which has been notably developed from the end of the nineteenth century.

Epiphany

In the Western churches, the Epiphany ('manifestation') became an occasion to celebrate one element in the story of Christ's birth, the visit of the far-travelled magi, understood as the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. Matthew's account speaks simply of 'wise men from the east'; later tradition fixed their number at three, made them kings and recalled their resonant names — Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar.

In this perspective, Epiphanytide is an apt season to pray for the worldwide mission of the Church. The feast of the Conversion of St Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles, appropriately falls in the Epiphany season, as does the Week of Prayer for Christian

Unity. In the Eastern churches, the Epiphany is, rather, the celebration of Christ's baptism at the hands of John, when the heavens were opened and a voice from heaven declared Jesus to be God's beloved Son. The miracle of Cana in Galilee, where Jesus 'first manifested his glory', follows immediately:

The arrangement of the Sundays of Epiphany in the Revised Common Lectionary deliberately draws out these aspects.

The season of joyful celebration that begins at Christmas now continues through the successive Sundays of Epiphany, and the festal




cycle ends only with the Feast of the Presentation (Candlemas). The child who has been manifested to the magi at his birth is now recognized by Simeon and Anna, when he comes to be presented in the Temple according to the Law of Israel. He is both 'a light to lighten the Gentiles' and 'the glory of God's people Israel'. But the redemption he will bring must be won through suffering; the Incarnation is directed to the Passion; and Simeon's final words move our attention away from the celebration of Christmas and towards the mysteries of Easter.

The Gospel according to Matthew

The pattern of readings from the Bible for use in Christian worship is known at the lectionary. Each Sunday three bible readings are prescribed: a passage from the Old Testament, the Apocrypha, or the Acts of the Apostles; another from either the Book of Revelation or the Epistles; and finally a passage from one of the four Gospels.

The pattern of readings runs in three-year cycles; the gospel readings in the first year (Year A) are taken from the Gospel according to Matthew, those in the second year (or Year B) from



the Gospel according to Mark, and in the third year (or Year C) come from the Gospel according to Luke. Portions of the Gospel of John are read at certain festivals every year.

On Advent Sunday (27th November) we begin Year A, so the gospel readings will be from Matthew. Here is a guide to this Gospel.

For convenience, the book can be divided into four structurally distinct sections: Two introductory sections; the main section, which can be further broken into five sections, each with a narrative component followed by a long discourse of Jesus; and finally, the Passion and Resurrection section.

- 1. Containing the genealogy, the birth, and the infancy of Jesus (Matthew 1; Matthew 2).
- 2. The discourses and actions of John the Baptist preparatory to Christ's public ministry (Matthew 3; Matthew 4:11).
- 3. The discourses and actions of Christ in Galilee (4:12–26:1).
 - I. The Sermon on the Mount, concerning morality (Ch. 5–7)
 - II. The Missionary Discourse, concerning the mission Jesus gave his Twelve Apostles. (10–11:1)
 - III. The Parable Discourse, stories that teach about the Kingdom of Heaven (13).
 - IV. The "Church Order" Discourse, concerning relationships among Christians (18–19:1).
 - V. The Eschatological Discourse, which includes the Olivet Discourse and Judgement of the Nations, concerning his Second Coming and the end of the age (24–25).
- 4. The sufferings, death and Resurrection of Jesus, the Great Commission (26-28).

The one aim pervading the book is to show that Jesus of Nazareth was the promised Messiah — he "of whom Moses in the law and the prophets did write" — and that in him the ancient prophecies had their fulfillment. This book is full of allusions to passages of the Old Testament which the book interprets as predicting and foreshadowing Jesus' life and mission. This Gospel contains no fewer than sixty-five references to the Old Testament, forty-three of these being direct verbal citations, thus greatly outnumbering those found in the other Gospels. The main feature of this Gospel may be expressed in the motto "I am not come to destroy, but to fulfill" (5:17).

Retirement of Janet Thompson as a Licensed Lay Minister

After 55 years as an authorised/licensed minister, first as a Methodist Local Preacher and then as a Church of England Reader/Licensed Lay Minister, Janet has decided to retire from active ministry at the end of this year. Janet's last service as a robed minister will be the Christmas Midnight Eucharist; Janet will preach at this service.

We invited Janet to offer a reflection on her ministry.



Janet writes:

As another year comes to a close I have decided after a great deal of prayerful consideration to retire from active ministry as a Licensed Lay Minister at the end of the year.

All my life I have lived in a Christian home and from an early age experienced life as a member of the Methodist Church. When I was 18 years old and following in my father's footsteps, I felt a call to becoming a Methodist Local Preacher. After two years training I became an accredited Local Preacher in December 1967.

When I got married my husband Alan, who had been bought up in the Church of England, joined the Methodist Church to allow our family to grow together in our Christian life. We became Sunday School leaders for teenagers, Church Stewards and Circuit Stewards. Through our married life I also have been part of three church choirs and a number of musical societies.

My husband and three sons always supported me throughout my time as a Local



Preacher, which position I held for 35 years until, as a family, we moved to the Church of England to Holy Trinity Bolton le Sands where Alan was brought up. There I became a Licensed Reader for 10 years and then over 10 years ago I moved to St Oswald's benefice where I have served as a Licensed Lay Minister. In December 2022 I will have completed 55 years of ministry.

During this time I have met some wonderful people, shared their happiness and shared their sorrow which I consider a great privilege.

Thank you to you all and particularly thank you to Alan who has always been there for me and our family. God bless you all.

This Gospel sets forth a view of Jesus as the Christ and portrays him as an heir to King David's throne, the rightful King of the Jews.

Some believe this gospel was written to the Jewish community, thus explaining all the allusions to passages of the Old Testament, however, see also Great Commission (which is directed at "all nations") and Interpretations of the Sermon on the Mount and Christian view of the Law.





RSPB Leighton Moss

The cold weather is upon us, and while it may be tempting to stay inside, you will be rewarded if you wrap up warm in your waterproofs and head out to see winter wildlife.



A highlight at this time of year is the array of wildfowl, decked out in its finest winter plumage.

Wetlands in the UK are vital habitat for ducks, geese and swans, as they leave their arctic breeding grounds in late summer in search of milder weather.

RSPB Leighton Moss has always been renowned for attracting a variety of overwintering ducks, with feeding opportunities for both dabblers and divers: teal, pintail, pochard, goldeneye and tufted duck to name a few. A firm visitor favourite on the reserve is a cinnamon teal x shoveler hybrid, an unusual looking duck, with the distinctive shoveler bill, who has returned to Leighton Moss for four consecutive winters. If you need a helping hand identifying what's what then why not join us on our Wonderful Wildfowl walk where an expert guide can give you a helping hand? Book online now! At this time of year, we get lots of questions about starling mumurations. In past years, we could expect to see the spectacle on the reserve in November/December time, with build ups of c100,000 birds. Last winter, however, we saw the biggest murmuration in February. We are unsure of what has caused this change — and we don't have any prior indication of what to expect this year. We recommend keeping an eye on our Facebook and Twitter pages, or our blog, if you'd like to stay up to date!

If you're looking for some family fun for your little ones, then our Robin Robin trail and activity pack is on sale throughout December! Aardman's film Robin Robin, a seasonal story about a little robin learning to love who she is, will be returning to Netflix this Christmas. Your family can join Robin and explore Leighton Moss on a big sneak! More details are available on our website, and packs can be purchased from our Welcome desk for £3 (normal admission fees apply).

While we're all feasting on mince pies throughout the winter months, your garden birds might also be feeling a little peckish. Birds benefit from high fat foods as the build their energy stores to aid them through cold nights. Suet based bird food products are a popular choice, and can even be made at home. Alongside traditional beef suet based products, the Leighton Moss shop now offers insect based suet as an alternative – come along and have a chat to our retail team for more information on how to attract birds to your garden!

Now, if you do love your garden birds, then why not take part in the Big Garden Birdwatch? All it requires is an hour of your time while you record the birds you see in your garden, park or favourite wild place. Not only is this lots of fun and a great way to feel connected to nature, but the submitted data is invaluable for keeping track of population increases and declines, which informs our conservation work. Check out the RSPB's website for more information.

We hope to see you on the reserve over the festive period.






