The people are greeted informally.

The Peace

The presiding minister introduces the Peace with these or other suitable words

The harvest of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

Preparation of the Table Taking of the Bread and Wine

Hymn We plough the fields

During the hymn

- the collection is received (please gift aid your offering if possible)
- the table is prepared for Communion.

1 We plough the fields and scatter the good seed on the land, but it is fed and watered by God's almighty hand: he sends the snow in winter, the warmth to swell the grain, the breezes and the sunshine, and soft, refreshing rain.

Giving of Communion

The presiding minister says the following invitation to communion

The table of bread and wine has been made ready. It is the table of company with Jesus, and all who love him. It is the table of sharing with the poor of the world, with whom Jesus identified himself. It is the table of communion with the earth, in which Christ became incarnate.

So come to this table, you who have much faith

and you who would like to have more; you who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time, you who have tried to follow Jesus and you who have failed;

Come.

It is our Lord who invites us to meet him here.

God's holy gifts for God's holy people.

All Jesus Christ is holy,
Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.

The people receive communion.

All are welcome to come forward to receive Communion or a blessing. If coming for a blessing please carry this booklet so the minister knows. If you wish to remain quietly in your places, please do so.

During the administration of communion, anyone who does not wish to receive communion is invited to give thanks for the saving death and resurrection of Jesus and ask him to be with them now.

Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally,
