Welcome to our March Parish News

Dear friends,

I am writing this letter, my last for the Parish News, on Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. Lent is the season of the Church year that focuses most starkly, perhaps, on the themes of change and journey. Lent invites us to walk the way of the Cross with Jesus, from Ash Wednesday to Holy Week and thence to Easter Day.

The seasons of the Church year remind us of, and help us to reflect on, the seasons of our own lives and the life of our world. In my letter last month, I said that our lives are journeys of beginnings and endings, of endings and beginnings. There is a saying that to live is to change and to have lived well is to have changed often.

So, after 5½ years as Vicar of the United Benefice it is time for say farewell, as I take early retirement from stipendiary parish ministry in the Church of England and move on to pastures new. I am looking forward to giving more time to my ministries as a counsellor and a spiritual director. I am also looking forward to assisting in parish ministry without the demands and responsibilities that come with being an incumbent.

I will take with me many good memories from my time here; of people and times shared in worship and events across our three churches. I am grateful for the support given by people during some of the more complex and challenging periods.

It is true, of course, that none of us can foresee what we may have to deal with in life. The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic was significant on all of us; to find our lives so restricted for two years was really hard. The war in Ukraine and the cost of living crisis continue to affect us in real ways. become so knowledgeable of charity law in my work as a charity trustee and need to give so much time to this work. Understanding the intricacies of leading one United Benefice made up of



two parishes, with one parish including a district church, has not always been easy.

There is a prayer used in some places when someone is leaving. So, I offer these words as I come to end of my tenure as your Vicar: As I leave, I ask forgiveness where I have failed you. I give thanks for all you have given to me. I assure you of my love and prayers.

Given that life is about change, this must include our understanding of God as well as ourselves. So, as we each journey on I encourage you to always be open to change and welcome the new opportunities and experiences that come your way.

A community or organisation is not about any particular person, of course; Vicars come and go. The life of the United Benefice continues during the vacancy under the care and oversight of the licensed lay minister and the churchwardens, supported by a number of retired clergy and the Archdeacon and the Area Dean. In due time a new Vicar will be appointed and you will enjoy the ministry of a new incumbent, who will come with their insights and wisdom to share with you.

Now, please pray for Elizabeth and me as we journey on. Be assured of my prayers for you. May we each travel on with God, knowing God's Love and Light enfolding us and guiding us along the way.



Charity Coffee Morning in Memory of Dr Monika Placzek

On Saturday 4th March from 10.00 – 12.00 there will be a charity coffee morning in aid of ADM Nepal at St Oswald's Church in Warton. It is being held in memory of Dr Monica Placzek who was one of the founders of the charity.

Monica was a Consultant Paediatrician in Lancaster and well known to many in the area. After she retired, she went to Nepal as a volunteer to work for a short time in a children's home in Kathmandu. Volunteering there at the same time was Anne Allen and together with Dot Coupe who had also volunteered there, they resolved to improve the lives of the young people which led to them setting up the charity ADM Nepal in 2016.

Initially they concentrated on improving the sanitation, living conditions and diet of the children. They raised money to move the children into more suitable accommodation, took them on trips into the countryside and employed someone to help with homework to improve their educational attainment. Now the charity also supports a second children's home and a Thalassemia Clinic and, as the children become old enough to leave the home, they help with the cost of college courses enabling the young people to follow their dreams.



The Junior Church at St Oswald's Church have had close links with the charity over a number of years, raising money for them, exchanging emails and letters with the children in Nepal and collecting things to be taken out to the children such as toothbrushes and socks. Monica came to tell them about each of her trips to Kathmandu and share photos and her experiences with them.

Monica died last year after a courageous battle with cancer and the most fitting way to pay our respects seemed to be to raise money for the charity and the young people in Nepal who meant so much to her.

You are warmly invited to join us in celebrating this wonderful woman. Junior Church Lent Challenge

Many people give things up for Lent, as a form of fasting. We are turning that idea on its head with our Lent Project. Instead of giving something up, we will be giving to those for whom fasting is not a choice but often a reality, the homeless people in this area.

Each Sunday in Lent, we are aiming to give an item per family to be donated to the Lancaster and District Homeless Action Service (LDHAS). To ensure that those donations are appropriate we will be contacting the charity each week to ask what they need. These items will be listed in the pew sheet and collected the following Sunday.

Anyone across the Benefice who would like to join us in the project would be very welcome. Please keep an eye open for more information in the pew sheets.

LDHAS was set up in 1987 by a group of local churches. It is a day centre which provides a friendly, warm and safe environment, free of judgment, for vulnerable people and those whose lives are in crisis. The support they offer includes food, shower and laundry facilities, access to phones and computers and help to access support from other agencies.

Their clients are ordinary people who circumstances have altered their way of life. The issues they face include financial and budgeting difficulties, relationship breakdown, lack of social and family support, leaving care, prison or rehab, mental health issues and substance misuse.

Since the charity started, it has been based in a portacabin in Edward Street in Lancaster. That site is scheduled for redevelopment as part of the Canal Quarter and they plan to move into new premises at 2 Aalborg Place later this year. Builders are currently refurbishing the first two floors to provide facilities to support the homeless and they have launched an appeal to raise money to develop the top floor into office space.





What a busy start to 2023 at Archbishop Hutton's Primary! We have had sporting success, fabulous trips and some visitors in school.

The Class 3 and 4 team came third in the athletics competition at Lancaster and Morecambe College. Class 1 and 2 have been learning to ride a bike. We had a fantastic time at the Swimming Gala, winning many of the races. Mrs Gavriluk reports that everybody competed at the highest level and showed a great display of their swimming skills. Archbishop Hutton's were placed second overall and the team all received a silver medal. Our school hosted the local school's Cross Country competition. All the children in Years 3 to 6 took part in 6 races. We won 8 medals - 3 golds, 2silver and 3 bronze. As a result, we were also crowned champions - for the fourth year in a row!

Class 1 and 2 went to Lancaster to visit the Judge's Lodgings. They looked at and learnt about toys from the past. They also took part in a Victorian Classroom lesson, to learn about children's lives in the past. The Class 1 girls thought the Victorian teacher was very strict! Class 4 visited the Maritime Museum in Lancaster to learn about life as a Viking. As well as meeting a Viking who talked about his life, they also explored the museum and learnt all about life in Lancaster's past. Class 4 had an incredible day out at the Manchester AO Arena, as they took part in the Young Voices Concert. Performing alongside 8000 other children, they sang, chanted and boogied their way through a spectacular 90-minute show. It really was a truly unforgettable experience.

Class 3 and 4 were visited by teachers from Brockhole on Windermere to learn all about our use of water. They looked at what we use water for, how much we use, how we can save water and where our water comes from and goes. Andrew from The Dog's Trust visited school to help us understand the importance of being safe around dogs. We learnt what dogs like and don't like, how to look after a dog and how to spot when dogs like to be left alone. Award winning artist, Peter Swidrak spent the day in school on Wednesday. Peter introduced each class to some of the world's most famous artworks and led them through the process of creating their own. It was a really interesting day and a great opportunity to explore the creative process.

Following the devastating earthquakes in Turkey and Syria, parents donated warm clothes and sleeping bags which will be taken to the people who need them and we also had a non-uniform day and raised over £200 in cash for the appeal.

How to be Greener

For Peat's Sake

Thousands of years ago a mossy landscape lived and died but did not decay.

Trapped in ground so wet that it could not decompose, the dead moss instead piled up, each layer pressing those beneath, into a thick, muddy mass called peat. On dry land, dead plants break down and their carbon is released into the air. In a bog, the carbon is trapped for ever, as long as it's not disturbed! Lowland peat bogs at one time ringed Morecambe Bay.

Licence to Exploit

Over generations we have massively underestimated peatlands and saw them only as wastelands. It takes 1,000 years for a meter deep of peat to form. But not very long to destroy it... drained for grazing, burned for grouse shooting, mined for compost and dug for fuel. Here in Warton, on the Mires, we have our very own peat deposits 4 metres deep, so they began to form 4,000 years ago!

As we began to understand the threat of climate change, trees emerged as a natural solution and we concentrated on planting millions of them. But we paid little attention to peatlands, the unsung heroes of carbon capture. Peatlands store twice as much carbon as all the world's forests!

Disturbed peatlands change from being a carbon store to a carbon emitter. Damaged peatlands emit a dizzying two billion tons of accumulated carbon every year, which is the last thing we need when our climate is in crisis! 80% of our UK peatlands are degraded. There's more! They can no longer hold back water, causing much of the flooding we see currently. And sadly, their unique plants and creatures can no longer thrive and add to the massive loss of bio-diversity.

There's Hope

Peatlands can be healed but it takes a long time and it's not cheap. They need rewetting by blocking any drains and replanting with sphagnum moss to recreate the original, waterlogged conditions. The soggier, the boggier. You don't have to go far to see how well they can be restored, just go along to the Wildlife Trust's Heysham Moss <u>https://tinyurl.com/yc5v3rjb</u> and Cumbria's Foulshaw Moss <u>https://tinyurl.com/2wbxydjd</u> There is still time to put peatlands, long manipulated, forever overlooked, on their rightful pedestal as nature's champion against climate change.

How you may ask?:

ONLY buy Peat-Free compost or get a compost bin, make your own and save £££ (When buying plants at a Garden Centre or Supermarket: ask 'Has this plant been grown in peat-based compost'?




A prayer for those who mourn
