Welcome to our November Parish News

Christmas is coming - the season of clichés. Is that too Scroogelike? A cliché is something we say even though we have said it many times before. I enjoy our family's empty but enjoyable Christmas traditions; e.g. — leaving a decoration up all year as if by accident, having that strange, but delicious, concoction bread



sauce, to name but two. Christmas is a time for repetition. The same applies to church — we like the same traditions, singing the same carols and, of course, hearing the same story from the shepherds to the magi, about a baby born in poverty. Does it matter there is no change? No! because we humans have not changed much in the last 2000 years. Jesus was born into a time of military occupation and a society divided by wealth. Children were slaughtered then; children have been slaughtered in the last few weeks. Do not we all hope and pray for peace — not just in the Middle East but also Ukraine and the many other places where there is oppression and suffering. Perhaps on a smaller, but just as important, scale, we feel tragedy in our own lives.

That is why we should, despite everything, enjoy Christmas. Our silly little traditions help us see there are other constants — of hope, joy and love. The real message of the birth stories in the Bible is that the hope is within the human race - summarised by that great word "Emmanuel — God with us". In the darkest times we can know that our world, our life, can be better than they are. We all carry the possibility of happiness and the ability to share that. As St John says, the light has not gone out. The scruffy shepherds and posh magi were all filled with awe when they saw the simplicity of a baby. So, can we feel that? We feel the pain of the suffering today, but we can see the hope of a world, of a life, that can be.

I wonder what has happened in your life since last Christmas. On a wider scale, I do not think any of us could have predicted the major news stories that came our way in 2023. As we move into 2024, we travel into the unknown but still the light will not go out. By twelfth night the decorations may seem a bit boring, but they will come alive again next December. Meanwhile, hanging from our lights will be a small angel on a swing, purposely forgotten, reminding us also that the world does not change and that the hope of Christmas goes throughout the year. The stories we love to hear at Christmas are not really about a baby but about the man, Jesus, who said "I came that you may have life in all its fulness". I hope and pray you have a happy, silly, traditional and real Christmas that sets you up for a year of hope in 2024. **Peter Mann**




A warm place to meet for a drink, cake and a chat! Toys are available for young children.


Junior Church



Gardening



Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening (Robert Frost 1874-1963)

Whose woods these are I think I know. His house is in the village though; he will not see me stopping here to watch his woods fill up with snow

These poignant words will echo in our minds as we take the obligatory Christmas walk through the glories of Hyning Wood. The scrunching of brittle leaves and the smell of Autumn gone, give way to the promise of the

year to come. Back home, we gather around the crackling fire, some to snooze, some to read, some to argue; but all to share in this joyous yuletide.

Our thoughts drift to planning the garden, another project to design and more seed catalogues to browse. The list is long and ambitious but with a little "pruning", we have a plan! Alongside dreaming of lighter, longer days, come the tasks that we need to complete whilst the garden plants are at rest. A little time spent now, will pay dividends for the year ahead; here are some suggestions to ponder and tackle:-

Take care of garden structures and seats, which may have suffered in the wind and rain by making small repairs and reviving, when dry, with preservative or appropriate paint. Clean and oil tools, sharpening secateurs and shears (a cathartic pastime, I'm assured!). If you can still get into your greenhouse, clean the glass to maximise light and wash pots for reusing in the coming season. Wrap up the outside tap to protect from frost. Empty mowers of fuel, clean and oil blades then book a service to avoid that last minute Spring panic! Turn and chop compost heaps adding any last-minute leaves which may have fallen onto paths and beds. Brush gritty sand over brick paths, to keep moss at bay and to prevent slippery surfaces. Remove ivy from drystone walls, taking care not to damage these heritage structures. Place a small table and chairs in a sunny spot, to make the most of the last rays of Winter sunshine. To gladden the heart, we don our gilets, gather rugs and enjoy our coffee & cake surrounded by the last vestiges of nature's bounty and beautiful bird song.

In January, look out for seed potatoes and onion sets coming into nurseries; the more unusual varieties can get snapped up early, so don't dilly dally on the way! Pink Fir Apple, Kestrel and Charlotte potatoes are all good choices for growing in large pots or sacks. Chilli lovers may wish to start some seeds inside, on a windowsill with radiator for warmth. Search out bargains, as garden centres and nurseries clear old stocks of plants and bulbs. Tulips and Lilies can still be planted in January ... then relax and breathe! Our New Year's resolutions are to recycle any plastic containers as seed trays, to experiment by adding more grit or Perlite into peat free composts and to grow more vegetables and cut flowers. We wish you all a very Happy Festive Season and do hope that you will love our NGS Christmas Tree at the Festival. We look forward to welcoming you to our gardens and allotments, which will be open for the NGS on 15th & 16th June 2024; make a note in your diaries now!

It's hard to believe we are already in December. Life in school has been busy as usual so the first months of the school year have whizzed by.

Class 1 have had a visit from the RNLI as part of their work on safety and special people in our community. They learnt about the boats, how to stay safe near water and how to float in the sea if they ever needed to be rescued. 
