

## Welcome to our November Parish News

"Do you remember what we were doing this time last week?" is a question my wife finds annoying when we return from holiday. The truth is I am testing myself and I like basking in nice memories.



Memories are such a big part of our lives and November is the month of memories. There is All Saints' Days when we remember fellow travellers in the faith and seek for inspiration from their lives. Then there is All Souls' Day to remember all whom we have known and loved and who have been part of our lives. There is bonfire night which seems, thankfully, to have been stripped of its original memories. Finally, we have Remembrance Sunday that seems just as relevant as ever as we remember those who have died, and those who still suffer, in armed conflict.

What, however, are memories for? I do not want to enter the realm of analysing memories – that is for the experts. I want to say two things: memories are a powerful part of our lives but we must not let them become dead ends. I have been privileged to lead many civic remembrance services and I have been moved by who comes, from the smart older people wearing, for example, their white berets of the Arctic Convoys to the little Brownies and Cubs walking proudly down the aisle with their pennants – all to honour memories; but then what?

We all have a vast database of memories we call our experience. Some are good, some are bad, some can never be faced, some inspire us, some mar our present. Surely, we should use our memories to build a new future. Have you seen "The Great Escaper?" It is beautiful, not just for the superlative acting of Glenda Jackson and Michael Caine but for how it handles memories. It is far more than a "plucky old man" film. The main character has a memory of D-Day he needs to deal with and that enables him to have a much more realistic idea of the present and so he can help himself and other people.

Memories should not be a dead end. Jesus understood the power of memories. At the last supper he set up a dynamic memory which, when we use the words "do this in remembrance of me", links us with him and his message of love, hope and peace. The memorio is so simple – a piece of bread and sip of wine- that says so much. We know that the early Christians did just what we do, and they used it as a launch pad to tell and live the good news. We cannot ignore our memories, but we can use them to build our future.

At this time of year, we often say "Lest we forget". Quite right. We should also say what my smart watch says to me every so often "Remember to move".

Let us remember, value and move forward this November.







## Gardening

The leaves, frost-crisp'd, break from the trees.....And fall. (extract from November night by Adelaide Crapsey, 1878-1914)

It reminds me of childhood; the smell and the sound of dry leaves beneath my red welly feet and the gathering of this precious cargo to make the priceless leaf mould.

You might think that there is nothing left to do after last months' list but there are lots of really quick wins for early flowers and vegetables in 2024. Our 3 top tips this month are, a direct sowing of Aquadulce Claudia Broad Beans & Elephant Garlic along with Cupani Sweet peas (under glass protection, in loo roll holders!). Why not give them a try, they are surprisingly hardy and will reward you handsomely.

Just in case there is an early frost, give extra protection to cold frames & containers by adding bubble wrap to the outside and raising the pots off the ground. Wrap up Tree Ferns by stuffing the crown with straw, pulling the fronds upwards (if you have any) and wrapping in layers of sacking. Bring any other tender plants into a greenhouse and after the first frost, store dahlias in a frost-free place. Rhubarb can be divided, to rejuvenate it for early forcing next year. Don't forget to harvest the last of the apple crop and store or make fabulous crumbles, pies and chutney...Now you're talking!

If you have been growing chillis, it's time to harvest them; maybe prick the skins and add to good quality olive oil or hang up to dry to enjoy their heat in dishes throughout the Winter months.

Tall roses should be reduced by 1/3 to protect them from strong winds. Plant your Spring bulbs but leave tulips until later in November, to avoid "tulip fire". Biennials such as Wall-flowers & Sweet Williams can be planted out for a wonderful Spring display.

Bring pots closer to the house to enjoy some Winter favourites at close quarters. Hellebores, snowdrops and other early flowering bulbs will gladden your heart, as the nights draw in. Don't forget to leave some seed heads for our feathered friends; goldfinches love our teasles and their flashes of gold and red will brighten your day.

Christmas will soon be upon us and time to think about appropriate "green" ideas as gifts for family and friends. Why not give a tree as a lovely family present? Maybe a hedgehog house, bug hotel or bird box, all of which are easy to make. Wreaths and swags can be made using hedgerow twigs and old man's beard, twisted and decorated with seed heads, cones, leaves and berries. How special and thoughtful it feels, to give and receive handmade treasures using Mother Nature's harvest!

It's been a long time since we last did an entry for the Parish News, so we thought we'd try and get back in the swing of it!

All our Sections (Beavers (6-8 year olds), Cubs (8-10.5) and Scouts (10.5-14.5) are back after the Summer Break and straight into this year's programme, ably assisted by our Young Leaders (14.5-18) most of whom are also Explorers at our local Silverhelme Unit and our adult Leaders.

We had a great summer. Our Cubs held a weekend camp, and our Scouts had their 4-night Summer Camp, both at our local Scout Campsite (Silverhelme); pitching and striking tents, knife, axe and saw work, campfires, cooking, conservation, orienteering, hiking, volleyball, "wide games" and so on.

Both camps worked really well, and the youngsters were great.

At the other extreme, three of our Young Leaders took part in one of Scouting's more difficult challenges, the Explorer Belt. The Belt involves getting yourself to a selected country overseas, with 2 or 3 teammates, travelling around that country for 10 days, largely without Leaders, and completing a number of challenges and a major project along the way. Easy it is not. Only 1 in 900 Explorer Scouts complete the Explorer Belt so to have Daisy, Elinor and Laura all gain it in a single year is a little bit awesome we think. Their expedition was held in North Macedonia. James, another of our Young Leaders, took part in a Scouting trip to Austria this summer too, where he had two weeks of activities and visits.

This is where Scouting can take you, from a weekly Village Hall meeting, to anywhere in the world... in recent years our Scouts and Young Leaders have "Scouted" in Denmark, Finland, Austria, North Macedonia, Albania, Greece, Bulgaria, Finland, Nepal and Japan.

More importantly, as well as "Everyday Adventure", our Beavers, Cubs and Scouts learn useful "Skills For Life": first aid, how to handle emergencies, initiative, teamwork, leader-ship, resilience, tolerance for others, and so much more.
