From the Vicar

Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul, and why are you so disquieted within me? O put your trust in God, for I will yet give him thanks, who is the help of my countenance, and my God'. Psalm 42:11



As we journey through Lent, we have been reflecting in our worship on the posture of humility and obedience, the reality of suffering, and the opportunities for growing faith that come through daily depending on God.

Jesus's ministry began with a period of real difficulty – whether we translate his period of time in the wilderness as a time of 'testing' or of 'temptation', it was a time where all of his resource was stripped away except for his ability to pray and where each day he was faced with the choice to surrender to God's will, or to try to muster his own strength to continue.

It is one of the many paradoxes of our faith that we find the power of God made manifest through human weakness — and so if we are feeling weary and like we have nothing left, that is often where we find God breaks through and shows us that we can depend on Him, we can trust Him, we can rely on Him. Periods of difficulty are actually often the most fruitful in terms of growing our faith because we realise that we are not actually as independent and autonomous as we like to imagine we are: we are contingent beings, interdependent on God and on one another.

Lent may not be the most attractive season with its emphasis on self denial, penitence, and reflection – but the truth of our Gospel is that through death comes life – and we can't have the love and joy and hope of Easter without also knowing the wrestle, the fear and the pain of Lent and Holy Week.

Whatever your current circumstances, I pray that your walk with Jesus through this season helps you to grow in faith, knowing that God goes before you, and will provide for you in ways beyond what you can imagine.

Gardening



March (John Clare, 1793-1864)

March, month of "many weathers," wildly comes in hail, and snow, and rain, and threatening hums, and floods.....

On reading this beautiful prose from John Clare's "The Shepherd's Calendar", one can't help but wonder whether the pattern of weather has really changed very much since this was first published in 1827. Imagine the tweed jacketed gardeners of Regency times tending their plots. Come wind, come rain, brief days of sun or snow, the garden still beckons, so don your Goretex (other brands are available) or tweeds & go for it!

March is the last real chance to tip-toe into the flower beds & thoroughly remove the annual weeds which are starting to appear; Creeping Buttercup, Dandelions to name but two. On a positive note, it is also a fantastic opportunity to spot more desirable "self-seeders" such as Honesty, Fennel, Wild Carrot, Angelica, Verbena and Nigella (unlikely to be the one of culinary fame!). These may be potted up to replant elsewhere or left to their own devices to create a natural effect. Clumps of perennials are crying out to be split; Hostas, Thalictrum, and the like can be divided with ease using back to back forks and gentle teasing; very satisifying! For those of you who grow ornamental grasses such as Miscanthus & Stipa Gigantea, now is a good time to make some divisions.

Cut the stems of Dogwood back to just above the ground and make new plants from the cuttings. Tendrills of Wisteria should be taken back to the 2nd node (sorry, we forgot to tell you this in February!); mature plants will flower beautifully in June. Prune back some Clematis (code 3) to ground; these are the late flowering ones. If it flowers before June, leave it alone. Treat yourself to a few new shrub and climbing roses perhaps, for summer fragrance and repeat flowering? Start dormant Dahlia tubers into growth by placing in a light and frost free place. Pot on chillis & tomatoes into peat free multipurpose compost. Plant chitted potatoes into pots or the ground. Start to support perennials with sturdy twig cages, before they become too large and unwieldy.

Pests are already lining up to make mischief, those tiny slugs are appearing everywhere, especially under plastic pots. Time to take action; try a garlic spray and wool pellets around tender new shoots or beer traps and just be vigilant. The next little thug to raise its ugly head is the dreaded vine weevil. On dividing and repotting my beloved Auriculas, I was alarmed to find that the grubs had already made their presence felt. They love pots, so take time to empty, inspect, destroy & replace with fresh compost. Nematodes are available for slugs and vine weevil & can be applied when temperature is above 10°C.

If the rain finally stops, fork, scarify, edge and lightly mow the lawn or resolve to leave some "no mow" areas to add plugs or seeds of wildflowers. Don't forget our feathered friends will be starting to nest and they might love some sheep's wool to line their nests!

May you be held by the God of compassion as you remember your loved ones today.


