So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.

We come to the end of a very busy season in the Church's year – in the 4 short months since I began ministry here we have journeyed through Lent, Passiontide, and Easter – and at our Pentecost celebrations we rejoiced in the coming of the Holy



Spirit amongst us, equipping and enabling us to serve faithfully and with great confidence and power.

We are praying for the outpouring of the Spirit on our congregations and communities, and looking for ways in which God is breathing new life among us. I have been so moved by the way that very many different people are being joined together in real unity around this important part of our mission, and I am excited to see where the Spirit leads us as we seek to serve Him and make Jesus Christ known in our communities.

Gardening



Summer by John Clare (1793-1864)

"Come we to the Summer, to the Summer we will come, for the woods are full of bluebells and the hedges full of bloom, and the crow is on the oak abuilding of her nest, and love is burning diamonds in my true lover's breast...."

June and July mark the zenith of ebullient borders, fragrant roses compete with alliums, thalictrum, foxgloves and more; meadows begin to fill with wonderful wildflowers. This is the season when butterflies, bees and birds embrace the nectar filled tapestry of plants. For Six Warton Gardens & the Allotments, the demanding work is building to a crescendo, in readiness to welcome you, to share and enjoy our gardens! Each one has its own style and charm, packed full of ideas and inspiration. Make a note in your diaries for 15th & 16th June; a chance for you to commune with nature, to eat cake, buy plants and relax in the knowledge that you are supporting fantastic Nursing and Health Charities (ngs.org.uk). The days are long, the soil has really warmed up and seeds and weeds are romping away. Harness the hoe for the weeds then broadcast some annuals such as poppies and echiums; germination will be swift and hopefully reward you with some late summer flowers. It is also the perfect time to sow biennials, for flowering next Spring, such as daisies, sweet williams and wallflowers. These can be sown in trays, outdoors and then planted out in September to their final position.

You may have wondered what the "Chelsea Chop" is? Traditionally, it coincides with the Chelsea Flower Show and involves cutting back around half the stems of perennials to produce new growth and extend the flowering season. As we are north of Watford, we can consider early June to be a suitable time to get chopping! It is also a particularly good time to make new plants by layering; this is especially successful with clematis, honeysuckle, golden hop and hydrangeas. Layering directly into a pot is easier than you think. Remove a couple of leaves from the stem, which is still attached to its parent plant, sprinkle with rooting compound and anchor it down into peat free compost, securing with a u-shaped piece of wire. Remember to water regularly; roots will begin to form in 4-6 weeks and the new plant can be detached from the parent plant, once they are well established; giving you new plants for free! At long last, all that hard work of growing your own vegetables, is starting to reap benefits. We can't wait to harvest our peas, broad beans, perpetual spinach and even asparagus! Simple salad crops need regular picking to prevent them bolting and going to seed; succession sowing will prolong the season for you. June isn't too late to sow runner beans, carrots and some of the brassical family. There is nothing like the taste of home-grown vegetables and the carbon footprint is a mere slipper! Strawberries, redcurrants and other soft fruit are ripening fast but be sure to net them before the birds, caterpillars and slugs have their fill. Summer puddings, strawberry Pavlovas, raspberry almond tarts; now that's a mouth-watering prospect! Do find a moment to sit and enjoy the fruits of your labours; we will certainly be raising a glass to the NGS, once our loyal garden visitors have departed; cheers to a successful 2024!

Wildlife Gardening



Inspired by Eco Church, here is some of the National Trust's know-how for making your garden wildlife friendly:

Let the grass grow

Long grass is one of the rarest garden habitats and by letting some or all of your lawn grow you will make space for many plant and insect species. Mowing the lawn only once every four weeks gives 'short-grass' plants like daisies and white clover a chance to flower in profusion, boosting nectar production tenfold.

Bird box and feeding

Birds are an important part your garden's ecosystem. Help them thrive by planting trees like rowan and wild cherry, creating bird boxes and putting out bird food (not bread) in winter. Situate boxes and feeders well out of reach of cats and keep feeders clean.

Build an insect hotel

Leave piles of rocks, twigs and rotting wood in your garden. These will provide shelter for all sorts of important insects, such as beetles and spiders. Dead and rotting wood is a habitat which is in very short supply.

Create a pond

A pond is a real boost for wildlife. It doesn't have to be huge – you can use a buried bucket or trough. If you do want a big pond however, make sure there are sloping sides to help wildlife get in and out. A pond is best filled with unchlorinated rainwater from a water butt and planted with some native species.

Compost

A compost heap is a win-win: it gives you a way of turning waste into compost which will naturally enrich your soil, plus it may also provide a warm hiding place for many creatures including slow-worms. To avoid attracting rats, never add bread or other cooked food.

Leave a gap in your fence

Don't lock out hedgehogs and frogs. Make sure your garden fences have some gaps at the bottom that can allow wildlife to move through from plot to plot. This will help link different habitats together.

Grow flowers

Flowers look beautiful and bring colour and scent into your garden. They also provide food for many insects. Grow as many varieties as possible to ensure pollen and nectar almost all year round. Choose single-flowered varieties and native species if possible.

Have a break from weeding

Learn to relax about weeds. The leaves of plants such as nettles, dandelions, groundsel and even brambles are important sources of food for the larvae of many insects, including butterflies and moths. Some 'weeds' also flower for a long time, whatever the weather, so can provide nectar and pollen when other sources might be absent.



May you be held by the God of compassion as you remember your loved ones today.


