# Vicar's welcome

'As you go, preach this message: 'The kingdom of heaven is near.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give' Matthew 10:7-8



Jesus' words to his disciples as he commissions them are powerful and pertinent to us as we consider our own calling to follow Christ and to preach the good news. This is especially relevant as we enter into Advent, our season of penitence and spiritual preparation, before we celebrate Christmas, our reminder of the faithfulness of God in coming to His own to bring Redemption to His people.

As decisions have been made about our worship during this time, I am so conscious of the expectations of our community, and the difficulty of maintaining the integrity of our Advent as a time to slow down, to repent and to prepare ourselves to receive Christ afresh. How is this possible in amongst the tide of busyness? How can we observe diligently and faithfully this necessary season of spiritual preparation when externally diaries are full and resources are low? I wonder if the key lies in Jesus' words about giving and receiving.

In remembering that our lives are dependent on God, our hope is dependent on His faithfulness, our joy is dependent on our receiving as gift all that He gives us. Christmas is impossible if we haven't acknowledged our need of God and our inability to have it all and do it all. I pray that we can journey through this season of Advent together, encouraging one another to slow down and make time to be with God, remembering that extraordinary truth that 'the kingdom of heaven is near'.



#### **Junior Church News**

We have been busy this term thinking about the wonderful world God has created for us to live in and how we have not always treated it with the care and respect that it deserves. We have been thinking about what we should do about this. Should we just hope things will get better? Or maybe we should go on as we are and expect other people to fix the problem? Maybe it all makes us feel so worried and anxious that we don't believe anything we do will make a difference? Or maybe we should see this as a new, exciting way that we can serve God by learning a different way of living that does less damage and shares God's gifts more equitably.

During the Harvest Festival service, we spoke about how Eco Church provides us with a structure which helps us look at all the different aspects of our lives as a church community and as individuals, so that we can work out what we need to do to live more sustainably. Everyone in the congregation made a pledge to make at least one change towards this and we offered these pledges to God as gifts of gratitude for all he does for us. Earlier in the term, we found out about the work of three different charities that aim to reduce waste and support people who need help. We had a vote to choose the charity we wanted to support through a bake sale after the Harvest Festival Service. We chose FareShare, a charity that aims to reduce food waste by donating surplus food from farming, factories, shops and restaurants to charities who support those in food poverty.



We would like to say a huge thank you to all those who supported our bake sale and are thrilled to have raised £131. Do get in touch if you would like to join us. We meet during term time in St Oswald's Church Hall at the new time of 9.30 am. It is for children aged 3 to 11 with under 3's accompanied by an adult. We explore our faith together through activities, games, crafts, songs, drama and fun! Visiting children are always welcome.





The famous final words of this poem speak of optimism leading up to the Winter Solstice, something we all need to hold onto in the darkest days of November and December. This is the time for "planting" optimism in the form of bulbs and seeds. We are searching out the last-minute bargains, designing colour schemes with Tulips, Muscari, Scillas and Narcissi, to bejewel the flower beds and containers in Spring. Seeking inspiration from Dutch Masters' paintings of the 1700's, we can begin to dream of picking just a few tulip stems, to bring joy into the home and to share with friends.

Jack Frost always catches us out; we are busily protecting the tender exotics and plunging pots deeper into the soil, mulching around with blankets of leaves and compost. Dahlias have made a real revival and deserve a little extra care to store them safely over the Winter. Let the shoots die back, clean the tubers and dry them thoroughly, before wrapping in newspaper and storing in a cool dry place. Many specialist nurseries will now be offering bare-root plants; why not establish a native hedge, treat yourselves to some new roses or a specimen tree? This will provide shelter for birds and mammals and help to improve the biodiversity in your garden.

When you speak to most keen gardeners, they will tell you that their interest was kindled, as a child. An inspirational adult instilled the love of the outdoors, the joy of growing and creating something individual and special. Embracing nature, in a world full of gadgets, technology and artificial intelligence, feels even more important for future generations. Take time to inspire children or grandchildren by making a nestbox, bug hotel, hedgehog shelter or perhaps creating a wildlife pond and sowing some seeds.

On the vegetable patch, it isn't too late to plant garlic, sow broad beans, tidy asparagus and strawberries, then weed, before giving everything a good mulch. You may have even adopted the "no dig" principle and covered the plot with cardboard and compost over Winter. We will be giving this a go; better for carbon capture and environmentally very sound, not to mention, less work!

Don't forget to photograph the garden this Winter; this will help you to review planting and structural elements. Lay tracing paper over the photos and pencil in ideas to improve spaces and add style to your garden in the coming year. As 2024 draws to a close, enjoy poring over seed catalogues, deciding on some new flowers and vegetables to grow in 2025. Gather all those gardening books you've been too busy to read, put on a jumper, light a fire, and start the 'training' for next year!

In 2025, around 3,500 gardens will be opening throughout England and Wales for the National Garden Scheme, raising money for the Health & Nursing Charities. As the year draws to a close, we would like to thank everyone who has supported us in 2024 and look forward to welcoming you again in 2025.
