

Welcome

What is real? Over the last few years that has become an urgent question with the rise of AI and also scams, which most of us will have experienced, perhaps even fallen for. It is a dilemma.

It is also a dilemma for people of faith. How do we know what is real? My Christian journey has always involved a mix of faith and questions. Anything else for me would be unreal. It dismays me when people outside church see Christians as people who are simplistic and gullible. Nothing could be further from the truth. We find reality in our lived experience. What does our life teach us? Church is not a place for pretending but being real.

One particular technique for avoiding a certain kind of scam is to give our friends and family a secret word they must use. Similarly, in these dark months I suggest the secret word for our faith should be "light". If our faith does not make reference to light it is false. We have three examples: those mysterious figures, The Magi (January 6th) – followed the light of a star to Jesus; that great writer and leader St Paul talks about his conversion (January 25th) as a great light and finally the elderly Simeon when he meets the infant Jesus calls him the light for the nations. (February 2nd) They all know the reality of light in their own lives but in their own ways.

I like to pay for things with my phone. Every so often at the checkout a message comes up - "Verify who you are". How do we do that? With a fingerprint, our unique identity mark. We are all individuals with different life experiences. We cannot live other people's live, just our own. Who are we? What is our faith? We will only know by asking questions, not pretending. Whatever we discover, we know it is true if it contains "light" because, as John says, Jesus is the light that the darkness has not overcome. Have we found light in our lives? Where do we want light to shine in our lives?

"Authentic" is a much-overused word, particularly in adverts for restaurants, but authenticity is a beautiful idea; something we know when we see it. Church is a place to find our own authenticity and see the light in our own way. That certainly is not a scam. It is reality.

Being Real


Excerpt from The Velveteen Rabbit by Margery Williams

A donation of around £3 is invited.



St John's Yealand

With our hearts and minds full of happy times spent with loved ones at Christmas, we now embrace the New Year which is traditionally a time for resolutions. Maybe, this year we could consider our planet and resolve to think how our actions effect global warming and the environment. St Johns is aiming to achieve an Eco Church Gold Award. Wherever possible we use Eco Friendly and Fair-Trade products; recycling and composting waste to avoid landfill. The Church Yard is managed to encourage wildflowers, and wildlife with the provision of boxes for bats and birds. A rowan tree and cotoneaster provide berries for hungry overwintering thrushes and blackbirds.

It is hard to believe that Bubble Church has now been running for a full year at St Oswald's!

The concept for Bubble Church was developed in a church in London during lockdown when families had to stay in "bubbles" and were given well-spaced circles of carpet to sit on (hence the name).

The service contains all the features of any service – praise, confession, intercession, a bible reading and exploration all presented in a way that is completely accessible and meaningful to very young children.

The services were such a success that the Church of England has funded a pilot study in which churches all over the country are setting up Bubble Churches to see how well they work in different settings.

We were in the first cohort of churches to be selected and trained and are the only one in this diocese to run Bubble Church. The services are held on the second Sunday of each month. Initially they were held at 9.30am in St Oswald's Church and were preceded by croissant and fruit. Due to the time of the main service at St Oswald's changing, they have now moved to 11.30am in the Church Hall followed by a light lunch.

Over the year, 19 different families with 33 children between them, have experienced Bubble Church at St Oswald's. It is wonderful to get to know the families and to see the children enjoying the services so much.

We are blessed with a fantastic Bubble Church team who range in age from 8 to over 70. Each person has a specific role during a service such as serving refreshments, welcoming, puppeteering, doing the audio visuals or leading and they are all very committed and enthusiastic.

Everyone is welcome to services. You can sign up in advance through the Bubble Church website www.bubblechurch.org or just turn up on the day. Please do encourage friends and neighbours with young families to come and give it a try. It is a joy!

The Bubble Church dates: for the next few months are:-Sunday 12th January, Sunday 9th February and Sunday 9th March.

Junior Church

Junior Church meets at 9.30am every Sunday during term time. Most Sundays we meet in the St Oswald's Church Hall and on the second Sunday of each month we join the congregation for an All-Together service. We cater for children up to 11 years old (or a bit older if they want to keep coming), with under 3's accompanied by an adult.

The sessions in the hall start with a song and lighting candles. We share a joint activity to introduce a topic before splitting into three different age groups to explore the topic at an appropriate level through activities, games, crafts, songs and drama.

We come back together for a time of prayer before joining the congregation in church for Communion and telling everyone what we have been doing.

We focus on exploring what it means to be a Christian personally as we move through the church year and in the wider context of social justice. For example, during Lent we learn about a local charity that supports those who are struggling in some way and lead a Benefice wide collection to support them and each autumn we focus on how we can be better stewards of the amazing world God has given us.

It is wonderful to see the children build relationships and grow in confidence. The older children are all keen to be involved in the All-Together services, reading, leading prayers and helping with the welcome, collection, offertory or anything else that needs doing in a particular service. They are also keen to be involved in other aspects of the church such as the choir, joining the reading rota, helping with Bubble Church and with fundraising.

Gardening



The Darkling Thrush, Thomas Hardy, 1840-1928, Dorchester "I leant upon a coppice gate, when Frost was spectre-grey and Winter's dregs made desolate, the weakening eye of day"

There is something very special about a coppice gate, cleaved from the woodland; sustainable and long lasting. We are very fortunate that these skills still exist in the cooperatives, close by and handed down from generation to generation, over the centuries. Thomas Hardy paints a beautiful image, capturing the moment, slowing the pace and appreciating the low mid-Winter light. There is no better time to study the garden laid bare, the silhouettes of trees and the structure of your garden. Just when you think that "armchair" gardening is the order of the day, muscle up the energy to make a few small changes to your plot! This might just mean adding curves to borders, introducing some punctuations in the form of evergreen shrubs or creating some raised beds as a cutting garden or to grow vegetables.

We have a few tasks for you to undertake which we promise will be gentle on the body and mind; time well spent. In the garden, tidy and prune shrubs such as Buddleia, Cornus, Climbing Roses and clip evergreen hedges to crisp up their profile, before our feathered friends begin to nest. Cut Wisteria back to the 2nd node in February, to ensure a wonderful floriferous display in late May. Hellebores give such lasting joy in the Winter months; their subtle pinks, whites and lime greens are magical and cutting off their leaves enhances their beauty.

This more dormant period is also a good time to divide and curate perennials, mulch and add compost to flowerbeds and sprinkle a balanced, slow-release fertiliser such as bone meal at the base of hedges. If you are growing soft fruit bushes and fruit trees, then the fertiliser should be high in potash (seaweed or wood ash is ideal). Finally, once primroses and snowdrops have finished flowering, take a few minutes to divide clumps and re-plant in pots or into the ground, to increase your own stock and to give to friends.

Back indoors, sort through your seed packets, discarding old seeds and make a resolution to grow something new. As February draws to a close, consider summer bulbs, ordering some to give colour and joy to the months ahead. Gladioli, Eucomis, Galtonia Candicans and Acidanthera are some of our favourites. Bring in your garden tools to clean, oil and sharpen for the season ahead and don't forget to book the mower in for servicing! Please join us at the NGS Charity Coffee Morning on the 1st February at St Oswald's where you will find cakes, seasonal pots of bulbs, books, tombola and much more, to raise money for the wonderful charities (ngs.org.uk).

Being Kind

Kindness doesn't mean ignoring people when they do things that are unkind, wrong, ignorant, racist, or discriminatory. It doesn't mean keeping quiet when you disagree with someone about a moral issue. But it does mean treating people with respect. Sometimes the kindest, bravest thing we can do is stand up to someone who is being unkind. Doing so causes conflict. It will upset the person we are confronting. A nice person would see the potential for conflict and stay quiet. A nice person never wants to rock the boat. A kind person knows conflict is possible and acts anyway. A kind person knows they might create waves, and they are OK with that.

Sometimes kindness is really easy. It's sharing an unexpected compliment with someone. It's taking the time to remember someone's name and then using it the next time you see them. It's saying, "Thank you," "I appreciate you," "You are valued!" or "Are you OK?" It's letting people know that they are noticed, valued, and important. It's going a little bit (or a lot) out of your way to make someone's day better. Kindness is caring. It is love. It is understanding.

Whether it is easy or hard, kindness is something we can (and should) do every day. It is what we should value above all else as we raise our children. Kindness should be one of the highest standards by which we measure our leaders, our teachers, our politicians, our police officers...anyone! As adults, we must set the example for younger generations. We must show them by our actions, our words, and our choices, what it means to be kind. For it is only by watching good examples that children will learn what kindness really looks like. Whether you are a parent or not, children are watching you. They are watching how you interact with others. They are watching to see what you do when you witness something unkind. They are looking to you to set the tone. They want to see who you really are.

Kindness is that little voice in your head saying, "That's not right! You should do/say something!" when you witness unkindness, discrimination, bias, or ignorance. A kind person listens to that voice and finds the words to step in and stand up. Is that who you really are? If it is, in standing up, we must keep in mind Mahatma Ghandi, when he said, "Be the change you wish to see in the world." We won't see change and inspire people to think twice about their words and actions by using disrespectful, condescending, or hateful words to confront wrongdoing. If we are to inspire change, we must be the change. We must demonstrate how to respond to unkind behaviour by ourselves being kind. Standing up with kindness can be firm. It can sometimes be loud. And it can even be hard to hear...because sometimes the truth hurts. But kindness is always respectful. Kindness is a high moral standard. It is living a life that strives to always do what is right. It is understanding the impact our words and actions have on others (regardless of our intent). Kindness is a constant goal. It is not something to be conquered. Instead it is a life's work. It is apologizing when we fail and it is committing to do better. Kindness is understanding that we are all human, and thus kindness is also forgiving others when they fail at being kind, but also being clear that forgiveness comes with an expectation to do better next time.

Kindness isn't always easy. Sometimes it can be messy. Sometimes it can be scary. But it is always the right thing to do. ©Kristen Caminiti, 2019


